GEORGIA STATE (2-2, 1-2 SBC) vs. No. 20/21 COASTAL CAROLINA (5-0, 3-0 SBC)

THE KICKOFF: Coming off a hard-fought road win at Troy, Georgia State hosts undefeated and No. 20-ranked Coastal Carolina Saturday at noon at Center Parc Stadium on ESPN.

> Cornelious Brown IV threw two touchdown passes to tight end Roger Carter and rushed for a third score as the Panthers (2-2, 1-2 Sun Belt) scored 20 straight points in the third quarter and then survived a late Troy rally to win 36-34.

> Outside linebacker Jordan Strachan is the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week after collecting three tackles for loss, including 2.5 sacks, and recovering two fumbles, one of which he also caused, in the win over Troy. In the third quarter, he sacked and stripped the quarterback and recovered at the Troy 8-yard line, setting up a touchdown for a 33-21 lead. Strachan's first fumble recovery came in the second quarter as he scooped up a loose ball and returned it 63 yards to the Troy 20 for the fourth-longest fumble return in GSU history.

> Strachan leads the Sun Belt with 6.5 tackles for loss and five sacks, which has already tied the GSU season sack record. In the last two games alone, he has four sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and two caused fumbles.

> The GSU defense held Troy to just 40 yards rushing, the second-lowest figure in school history. The Panthers have held three straight opponents to 60 rushing yards or less, and GSU leads the Sun Belt in rushing defense at 97.0 ypg (No. 14 FBS).

> Averaging 42.0 points per game, Georgia State is No. 1 in the Sun Belt and No. 11 in FBS in scoring.

> Junior running back Destin Coates is the Sun Belt's leading rusher, averaging 126.0 yards per game (No. 5 in FBS). He has topped the 100-yard mark in three straight games. As a team, the Panthers are No. 14 in FBS in rushing (237.3 ypg).

> Coates topped the 1,000-yard mark for his career vs. Troy. He ranks eighth in GSU history with 1,061 rushing yards.

> Coastal Carolina (5-0, 3-0 Sun Belt), coming off a 28-14 victory over Georgia Southern, will be the third nationally-ranked opponent to visit Center Parc Stadium in the last five games, following No. 24 Appalachian State (the first ranked team to play on Georgia State's home field) last November and No. 19 Louisiana earlier this season.

> Georgia State won last year's meeting with Coastal Carolina 31-21 at Conway, S.C. The Panthers rushed for a school-record 350 yards (later broken), including three 100-yard rushers for the only time in program history: QB Dan Ellington (128), RB Tra Barnett (110) and RB Seth Paige (104).

> GSU leads the series 2-1, but the visiting team has won all three meetings.

> Georgia State's two losses are by a combined 10 points, with both coming down to the final possession, including a 34-31 overtime loss to Louisiana. Against Arkansas State, after the Red Wolves scored the go-ahead touchdown with four minutes left, GSU drove to the ASU 41 yard line before coming up short on fourth down.

> Redshirt freshman quarterback Cornelious Brown IV is second in the Sun Belt in total offense (275.8 ypg) and points responsible for (19.5 pg). He trails Coastal Carolina redshirt freshman QB Grayson McCall (278.5 ypg, 21.5 points responsible for pg) by a slim margin in both categories.

> The Panthers' top receiver is Sam Pinckney with 22 catches for 354 yards and five touchdowns. Over a two-game span vs. East Carolina and Arkansas State, Pinckney totaled 13 receptions, 280 yards and five TD.

> Quarterback Cornelious Brown IV and safety Antavious Lane, both redshirt freshmen, were named to the FWAA Freshman All-American Watch List. Junior center Malik Sumter has been tabbed to the Rimington Award Watch List.

> Placekicker Noel Ruiz, the grad transfer (North Carolina A&T), ranks fifth among all active FBS kickers with 286 points. He is third with 160 PAT and T-13th with 42 career field goals.

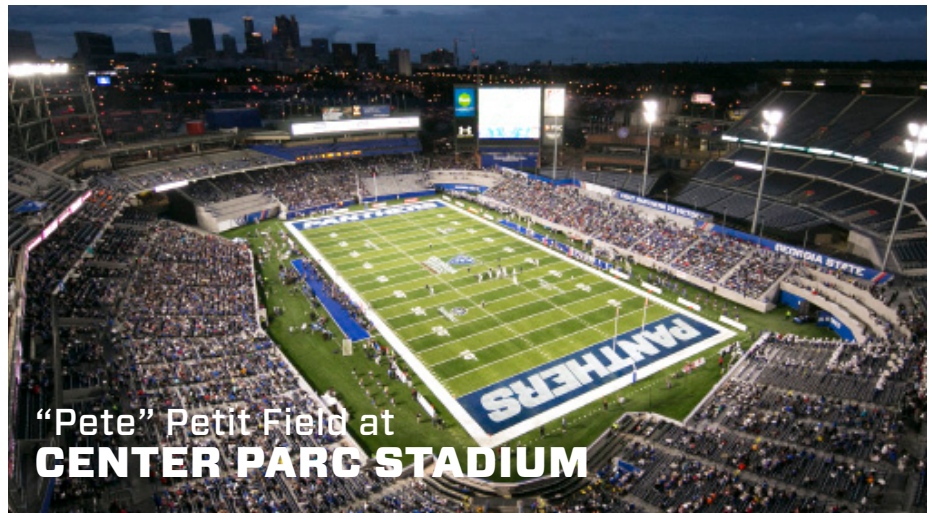

> The Georgia State defense scored touchdowns in back-to-back games. Redshirt freshman safety Antavious Lane returned an interception 34 yards for a score vs. East Carolina. Then linebacker Blake Carroll scooped up a fumble and returned it 74 yards for a touchdown vs. Arkansas State for the second-longest defensive touchdown in program history.

> Playing just its 11th season of football and seventh at the FBS level, Georgia State looks to build on a successful 2019 season, when the Panthers earned their third bowl berth in five seasons and second in three years under head coach Shawn Elliott. GSU finished 7-6 last season.

> In 23 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons and 18 teams that reached a bowl game or the NCAA playoffs.

GEORGIA STATE vs. RANKED TEAMS:

Georgia State is 0-7 all-time vs. ranked FBS teams, but the Panthers' first five games against ranked foes came at Power 5 teams ranked 12th or higher in the AP poll.

Most recently, Georgia State fell in overtime to No. 19 Louisiana in 2020.

GSU also had a close call at No. 9 Wisconsin in 2016, leading 17-13 with less than 10 minutes to play before the Badgers scored the go-ahead touchdown with 7:25 left and went on to win 23-17.

FUN BELT: The Panthers played in one of the highest scoring games in Sun Belt Conference history, falling 59-52 at Arkansas State. > Georgia State piled up 583 yards of total offense, the fourth-highest figure in school history, with 269 yards rushing and 314 yards passing, but the Red Wolves scored the

CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fourth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

Future phases of the redevelopment of this iconic property will include a new Georgia State baseball stadium, to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

go-ahead touchdown with four minutes left.

>GSU scored 52 points, the program high vs. an FBS opponent, for the third time in 12 games.

>QB Cornelious Brown IV tied the GSU record by accounting for five touchdowns. He threw three TD passes, all to Sam Pinckney, while rushing for scores of 35 and 11 yards. He finished with 314 yards passing on 18 completions and 83 yards rushing on 13 attempts.

> Sam Pinckney caught six passes for a career-high 146 yards and three touchdowns, covering 38, 23 and 21 yards.

> Making his first start at Arkansas State, junior running back Tucker Gregg responded with a career-high 142 yards rushing on just 14 carries, including a 7-yard touchdown run. He is the fifth different Panther to record a 100-yard game over the last two seasons.

A RECORD THAT WILL NEVER BE BROKEN: Georgia State put together the first 99-yard drive in program history against Arkansas State, needing only five plays and 1:48 to move from its own 1-yard line to paydirt. On the first play, Tucker Gregg raced 56 yards out to midfield, and four plays later QB Cornelious Brown IV scored on a 35-yard run.

DEFENSE RULES THE DAY vs. ECU: The Georgia State defense turned in a strong performance to key the Panthers' 49-29 victory over East Carolina. The defense did not allow an offensive touchdown to the Pirates, whose three touchdowns came on a pick-six, a fake field goal and a blocked punt. The Panthers allowed only 286 total yards (3.7 yards per play), including just 50 yards rushing, the third-lowest single-game total in GSU history. And of those 50 yards, 31 came on the fake field goal.

BRIGHT WHITE: Junior cornerback Quavian White leads the Panthers with two interceptions in the first three games. White had four tackles, 1.5 sacks, an interception and a pass breakup against East Carolina, helping hold the Pirates to 286 total yards and no offensive touchdowns.

Against No. 19 Louisiana, White made seven solo tackles in the game, along with an interception and two pass breakups. He also had one kickoff return (22 yds) and two punt returns for 17 yards, and he was tabbed to the weekly honor roll for the Paul Hornung Award, which recognizes versatility.

ON THE RUN: Georgia State ranks No. 14 in FBS in rushing with 237.3 yards per game.

> Destin Coates averaged 131.5 yards over the first two contests to lead the Sun Belt.

> Despite playing without Coates, the Panthers rushed for 269 yards vs. Arkansas State, led by 142 yards from Tucker Gregg.

> Last season the Panthers finished No. 13 in FBS in rushing (241.6) in 2019, led by senior

Tra Barnett (No. 11/111.8).

> GSU has rushed for 340-plus yards four times in the last 13 games: 340 vs. Arkansas State; 350 vs. Coastal Carolina; 390 vs. Troy; and school-record 414 yards vs. ULM.

> Over the last 22 games, Georgia State has averaged 233.4 rushing yards per game, including 250.7 over the last 13 contests.

THE HIT STICK: Redshirt freshman safety Antavious Lane leads Georgia State with 29 tackles and two interceptions.

He was named Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week after his 34-yard interception return for touchdown was a key play in the Panthers' 49-29 win over East Carolina.

Lane got his second interception at Troy as he grabbed a tipped ball in the end zone and returned it 42 yards.

NEW NAME, SAME GREAT PLACE: Georgia State's home facility is now known as Center Parc Credit Union Stadium, or Center Parc Stadium. The 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, was announced Aug. 11, 2020.

CAREER DAY FOR COATES: Taking over for GSU's all-time leading rusher Tra Barnett, junior Destin Coates responded with a career-high 150 yards rushing vs. No. 19 Louisiana in the season opener. That is the sixth-highest single-game rushing total in GSU history.

Coates was a workhorse, carrying the ball 34 times to tie the program record set by Barnett last season vs. Troy.

THE FRONT LINE: Georgia State's starting offensive line has combined for 106 career starts, led by senior left guard Shamarious Gilmore.

Gilmore has started every game the last three years (41 straight) and rarely come out of the game. He has earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors each of his three years, and he enters 2020 as a Preseason First-Team All-Sun Belt selection and a member of the Outland Trophy Watch List.

The Panthers also return junior center Malik Sumter, an All-Sun Belt honoree in 2019 who has been named to the Watch List for the 2020 Rimington Trophy, and junior right guard Pat Bartlett, who has 23 career starts. Sophomore tackle Travis Glover, who earned Freshman All-America honors at right tackle in 2019, has moved to the left tackle position manned by Hunter Atkinson the last four years. Sophomore Johnathan Bass has taken over at right tackle.

2019 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

Georgia State (7-6, 4-4 Sun Belt) tied its school record with seven victories and earned its second bowl berth in three seasons under head coach Shawn Elliott, with a trip to the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

> The Panthers posted their best home record at 5-1 while setting a program-record for home attendance.

> Earned the signature win in program history with the season-opening 38-30 victory at Tennessee, Georgia State's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent.

> Twenty-five season records, 17 single-game records and seven career marks were set or broken in 2019.

> GSU produced the most prolific offensive season in program history, setting school records for points (406), scoring average (31.2), total offense (5,718), total offense per game (439.8), rushing yards (3,141), rushing yards per game (241.6), rushing yards per attempt (5.3) and first downs (305).

> Georgia State ranked No. 13 in FBS in rushing with 241.6 yards per game.

> The Panthers accomplished all this despite starting quarterback Dan Ellington playing the final four games with a torn ACL.

ELLINGTON GRADUATES TO COACHING

STAFF: The newest member of the Georgia State coaching staff is former Panther quarterback Dan Ellington, who is now an offensive assistant coach.

A two-year starter and two-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection in 2018-19, Ellington passed for 4,566 yards and 34 touchdowns while rushing for 1,293 yards and 11 scores.

He gained national notoriety after leading the Panthers to their 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener. He further cemented his legacy by playing his final four games after tearing his ACL and led the Panthers to a bowl game.

GSU ADDS TWO GRAD TRANSFERS:

Two grad transfers are making an immediate impact.

> Noel Ruiz, a 2019 FCS All-American at North Carolina A&T, takes over the place-kicking duties. He was 23-for-27 on field goals last year, leading FCS with 1.92 per game while ranking fifth in percentage (.852) and 10th in scoring (9.7 ppg).

> Former Virginia Cavalier Chris Moore has earned a starting berth at safety. He played in nine games (five starts) in 2019 and made 42 tackles and two pass breakups.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In 23 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons and 18 postseason appearances, including two bowl games in his three years at Georgia State.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 23 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons, 18 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games in two of his three seasons in Atlanta.

Other highlights of Elliott's first three years at GSU include the first bowl victory in school history, Georgia State's first winning season as an FBS program, and school-record seven-win campaigns in both 2017 and 2019.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy

National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a record-setting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark at Georgia State Stadium.

Bolstered by one of the top rushing attacks in the nation, the 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt Conference squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a school-record seven

victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4) and per attempt (4.13). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign

NFL free agent contracts, is now with the Green Bay Packers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen.

Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist is GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton, now with the Atlanta Falcons. Hart is now with the Seattle Seahawks.

Individual honors in Elliott's first three seasons include 26 All-Sun Belt Conference honorees, Georgia State's first two players selected to the Reese's Senior Bowl, five former players signed to NFL free agent contracts and a first-round selection in the CFL draft.

The accolades extend to the classroom with GSU's first Academic All-American® as well as five Academic All-District® selections in three seasons. The Panthers posted a program-record 3.03 GPA in his Elliott's first semester, and then nearly matched that with a 3.0 for the spring 2020 term.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern

Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Confer-

ence Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

LOUISIANA 34, GEORGIA STATE 31 (OT)

Game 1: Sept. 19, 2020 • 12 p.m. (ESPN2)
Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State got a career-high 150 yards rushing from Destin Coates, but the Panthers fell to No. 19 Louisiana 34-31 in overtime in their season opener at Center Parc Stadium.

Coates, the junior from Tallahassee, Fla., scored the tying touchdown on a 4-yard run with 7:37 to play, knotting the score at 28-all, and then the GSU (0-1, 0-1 Sun Belt) defense came up with a huge stop to force overtime. The Panthers went on offense first but had to settle for Noel Ruiz's 25-yard field goal, and then Elijah Mitchell's 12-yard touchdown run gave Louisiana (2-0, 1-0 Sun Belt) the win.

Still, there were numerous positives for the Panthers in their season opener.

"It's a disappointing loss, but to play that team the way we did and have the opportunity to win at the end, I'm very proud of our football team," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I'm most disappointed that we didn't win because we had every opportunity to win the football game. I feel like we got worn down a little bit there in the second half, offensively and defensively, and some drives we didn't capitalize on like we should have. We had a chance to end it right there in regulation but we didn't finish the drive. I thought we had controlled the line of scrimmage for the most part of the game, and I thought we could do it there, but we came up short and had to punt it back to them."

"We got to overtime, and when you don't stick it in on that first drive, you've got to hold on tight," Elliott continued. "Hats off to them, they're a good football team and they played hard. It was a really good ball game, and I'm very proud of our players. Disappointed with the loss, but this Georgia State team has a chance to be a really good football team."

Georgia State jumped to a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter and took a 21-7 lead early in the third before Louisiana scored three straight touchdowns to take a 28-21 on a 2-yard scoring run by Trey Ragas with 11:54 to play.

But the Panthers answered with a 13-play, 75-yard drive directed by Cornelious Brown IV, the redshirt freshman making his first start under center. Brown hit senior Matlin Marshall for an 18-yard completion to the Louisiana 13-yard line, and then Coates carried three straight times for the touchdown and the tie.

After an exchange of punts, Louisiana took over at the GSU 45 with 2:39 to play, but the Panther defense held as Hardrick Willis and Jeffery Clark combined to sack a scrambling Levi Lewis on 4th-and-4.

Georgia State took over at the Louisiana 46 but couldn't convert on third down and had to punt and settle for overtime.

Coates was a workhorse throughout the game, tying the GSU record with 34 carries.

Brown completed 22 of 39 passes for 196 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed for 64 yards on 15 attempts, including a 12-yard scoring run that capped the Panthers' first touchdown drive and gave GSU a 7-0 lead with three minutes to play in the first quarter. After the GSU defense forced a punt, Brown engineered a 90-yard drive, hitting tight end Roger Carter for a 28-yard touchdown and a 14-0 advantage early in the second quarter.

Louisiana got on the board on Lewis' 18-yard TD pass to Chris Smith with 1:33 left in the second quarter and was driving again late in the half when Quavian White intercepted Lewis at the GSU 15-yard line to send the Panthers to locker room with a 14-7 lead.

Lewis was intercepted again on third play of the second half as linebacker Victor Heyward grabbed a tipped ball at the GSU 34 to set up another touchdown drive. Carter made a nice 25-yard reception down to the LA 4, and true freshman Marcus Carroll's 2-yard run put the Panthers' ahead 21-7 less than five minutes into the third quarter.

Elijah Mitchell led Ragin' Cajuns with 164 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Lewis was 21-for-37 for 279 yards and two scores.

On the first start for his quarterback, Elliott said, "I thought he managed our team very well. He took the opportunity in the run game when he had it and made positive yardage. He's going to learn from his mistakes, just like everyone else, and we're going to learn from our mistakes as coaches. I told everybody in that locker room that I'm damn proud to be their football coach. We would have liked to make another play to get that win, but it didn't happen today."

GEORGIA STATE 49, EAST CAROLINA 29

Cornelious Brown IV passed for 238 yards and three touchdowns, two of them to Sam Pinckney, as Georgia State scored 35 first-half points en route to a 49-29 win over East Carolina Saturday at Center Parc Stadium.

The Georgia State (1-1) defense did not allow a touchdown as the Pirates' three touchdowns came on a pick-six, a fake field goal and a blocked punt. The Panthers held ECU (0-2) to 292 total yards, including just 50 yards rushing, the fewest rushing yards allowed by the GSU defense since holding WKU to a school-record minus-2 yards in the 2017 AutoNation Cure Bowl and the third-lowest total overall.

The defense came up with three interceptions, highlighted by a pick-six by redshirt freshman Antavious Lane, along with nine tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including four sacks, as well as eight pass breakups.

"I think our defense was phenomenal today," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We just put the pressure on them all day long. It seemed like they had no answer for our defensive line and our pressure. It was fun to see. Even when we struggled offensively in the third quarter, the defense continued to pick us up. Just a phenomenal day on their part."

Pinckney finished with a career-high 134 yards on seven catches, including scoring plays of 38 and 13 yards.

The Panthers piled up 248 of their 486 yards on the ground, including a second straight 100-yard effort by Destin Coates (115 yards, 2 TD) and 78 yards rushing on just three carries by slot receiver Terrance Dixon.

Georgia State's 35 first-half points are a program record for points in a half. After East Carolina scored on Warren Saba's 28-yard interception return on the first play of the game, the Panthers reeled off four straight touchdowns and took a 35-13 lead into the locker room.

The Panthers responded immediately to their game-opening miscue as Brown directed a 5-play, 75-yard scoring drive in just 1:24, capped by Coates' 13-yard touchdown run. After the defense forced a three-and-out, Georgia State needed just 23 seconds to take the lead for good. Coates rushed 23 yards to the ECU 28, and then Brown hit Pinckney for a 38-yard touchdown, and the Panthers led 14-7 just four minutes into the game.

"You throw a pick-six on the first play of the game, but no one on that sideline blinked an eye, and that was great to see from our team, and especially from our young quarterback" Elliott said.

Another three-and-out for the GSU defense, and another Panther touchdown followed. This drive covered 61 yards on nine plays, capped by Brown's 22-yard TD pass to Jamari Thrash for a 21-7 lead.

Georgia State started the second quarter with a 77-yard scoring drive on which Tucker Gregg covered the four yards for his first touchdown of the season and a 28-7 advantage with 12:45 to play in the half.

After an ECU field goal, the Panthers next score was set up by Trajan Stephens-McQueen's interception at the ECU 44. Brown found Cornelius McCoy for 26 yards to the 18, and three plays later he hit Pinckney for the 13-yard touchdown with five minutes left in the half.

The GSU offense endured a sluggish third

quarter, including two turnovers, but the defense allowed just one field goal as the Panthers led 35-16 going into the final period.

That's when Lane, the redshirt freshman safety, stepped in front of Holton Ahlers' pass at the ECU 34-yard line and raced to the end zone, giving the Panthers a 42-16 advantage.

East Carolina made things interesting with consecutive touchdowns on a fake field goal, which resulted in a 31-yard scoring run, and then a blocked punt that was returned for a 29-yard TD, pulling within 42-29.

But the GSU defense came up with one more big stop, holding ECU on 4th-and-9 at their own 38-yard line with three minutes to play. The Panthers added their final score on Coates' 5-yard touchdown run.

ARKANSAS STATE 59, GEORGIA STATE 52

Game 3: Thur., Oct. 15, 2020 • 7:30 p.m. (ESPN)
Centennial Bank Stadium • Jonesboro, Ark.

In one of the highest scoring games in Sun Belt Conference annals, Georgia State and Arkansas State combined for 111 points and 1,192 yards of offense, but it was a late touchdown by the Red Wolves that gave the home team a 59-52 win over the Panthers in an ESPN Thursday night game at Centennial Bank Stadium.

Redshirt-freshman quarterback Cornelious Brown IV passed for 314 yards and three touchdowns, all to sophomore Sam Pinckney, and rushed for 83 yards and two more scores for the Panthers. His five touchdowns responsible for tied the GSU record.

Pinckney finished with six catches for a career-high 146 yards, and his three touchdown catches are one shy of the school record. It was the second-straight 100-yard game for Pinckney, who has caught five TDs in the last two games.

With GSU playing without the Sun Belt's leading rusher Destin Coates and top wide receiver Cornelius McCoy, junior Tucker Gregg stepped up with 14 rushes for 142 yards, breaking the century mark for the first time in his career on his 21st birthday.

"Sam and Tucker were workhorses tonight," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "The great thing about us offensively is that we spread the ball around to a number of people. If one guy goes down, we feel like we have another guy right there who can step up."

The Panthers (1-2, 0-2 Sun Belt) rushed for 269 yards as part of their 583 total yards of offense.

"It's a disappointing loss," Elliott said. "The effort is there. We played our hearts out against a good Arkansas State team and came up short. We're dealing with situations we have no control over, and you have to roll with the punches. Tonight we were short a few players and a coach (defensive coordinator Nate Fuqua) and came out on the short end of things."

Arkansas State (3-2, 1-1) was led by the quarterback combo of Layne Hatcher and Logan Bonner. Hatcher finished 21-of-28 for 332 yards and four touchdowns, while Bonner went 18-of-28 for 197 yards and three TD passes.

The Red Wolves scored the winning touchdown on a trick play, with Rashauud Paul hitting Lincoln Pare for a 22-yard touchdown pass on a reverse with 4:23 to play.

The Panthers drove to the Arkansas State 41, but Brown's fourth-down pass was just out of Pinckney's reach down the right sideline with two minutes left.

Jonathan Adams led the Red Wolves' receivers with 15 catches for 177 yards and two TD catches, while Dahu Green added nine catches for 172 yards and a pair of scores.

Arkansas State took an early 7-0 lead just over two minutes into the game on a 3-yard pass from Logan Bonner to Tyler Reed, set up by a fumbled snap on a GSU punt.

The Panthers used a school-record 99-yard drive to the game 7-7 with 4:34 in the first quarter. After taking over on the 1-yard line, Gregg burst free for a 56-yard run, and Brown capped the drive with a spectacular 35-yard run on which he dove for the pylon and the touchdown.

After an Arkansas State touchdown, Georgia State tied the game early in the second quarter as defensive end Jordan Strachan stripped Bonner and Blake Carroll scooped up the fumble and returned it 74 yards for a touchdown. It was the first fumble returned for a touchdown since Chandon Sullivan returned one against Georgia Southern in 2017. It was the second-longest fumble recovered for a touchdown in program history, only trailing Robert Ferguson's 88-yard return against ULM in 2013.

Bonner once again gave Arkansas State the lead with a 42-yard touchdown pass to Jonathan Adams with six minutes to play in the half. Brown answered with an 11-yard touchdown run just 90 seconds later, knotting the game at 21 with four minutes to play in the first half.

Hatcher found Green again for a 20-yard touchdown completion with 48 seconds remaining in the half to go ahead 28-21. However, the Panthers had enough time answer remaining as Brown found Pinckney on a 21-yard scoring pass to send the teams into the locker room tied at 28-all.

Pinckney gave the Panthers their first lead of the game just 90 seconds into the second half on a 36-yard completion from Brown, set up by a fourth-down stop by the GSU defense.

The Red Wolves scored touchdowns on consecutive possessions to take a 42-35 lead, but Gregg's 7-yard touchdown run tied the game at 42-42 with 4:44 to play in the third quarter.

After Blake Grupe kicked a 39-yard field goal to give Arkansas State a 45-42 lead, Pinckney caught his third touchdown catch of the game six seconds into the fourth quarter, a 31-yard completion from Brown, to give GSU a 49-45 lead.

Hatcher found Jonathan Adams on a 32-yard completion as the Red Wolves went back ahead 52-49 with 12:40 to play.

After a 29-yard field goal by Noel Ruiz tied the game at 52-52, Arkansas State took the lead for good on Paul's touchdown pass to Pare.

Roger Carter caught a pair of touchdowns from redshirt-freshman quarterback Cornelious Brown IV and Georgia State survived with a 36-34 win over Troy on Saturday at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Georgia State (2-2, 1-2 Sun Belt) topped Troy (3-2, 1-1 Sun Belt) for a second-straight season and won for the first time on Troy's home field, but the win wasn't secure until the very end.

"What a contest – the fight, the finish. I'm really proud of them," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We're playing on the road in the Sun Belt Conference and we found a way to win the game. That's what's most important."

Troy's Jacob Free, replacing the injured Gunnar Watson, found Reggie Todd on an 11-yard touchdown reception with 37 seconds to play, but the Trojans missed the two-point conversion that would have tied the game as Free's pass was incomplete out of the end zone.

Troy appeared to recover the ensuing on-sides kick, but video review showed that the ball did not travel 10 yards before the Trojans touched it.

Brown went 20-of-30 for 169 yards and two touchdowns, both to Carter, who finished with seven catches for 72 yards. On the ground, Destin Coates led the rushing attack with 25 rushes for 115 yards, while Tucker Gregg ran 10 times for 67 yards and a touchdown.

Trailing 21-10 with 5:29 to go in the second quarter, Georgia State scored 23-straight points and never trailed again.

Led by outside linebacker Jordan Strachan, the Georgia State defense allowed just 40 yards

rushing, the second lowest figure in school history (the GSU record is minus-2 yards vs. WKU in the 2017 AutoNation Cure Bowl).

Strachan, the junior from Kingsland, Ga., had 2.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries, and a forced fumble to go along with four tackles. He returned one fumble 63 yards to the GSU 20, and the other one came in the pivotal third quarter as he sacked Troy quarterback Jacob Free to force the fumble and recovered at the Troy 8-yard line. Four plays later, Brown scored from two yards out to put the Panthers up 33-21 with four minutes left in the third quarter.

The GSU defense also came up with interceptions by Antavious Lane, his second of the season, and Cameron Sims, both redshirt freshman.

Free finished 24-of-38 for 329 yards and two touchdowns for the Trojans but was also intercepted twice. Watson finished 8-of-10 for 78 yards before missing the rest of the game.

Georgia State scored on its first possession in the third-straight game as Brown hit Carter in the back of the end zone to give the Panthers an early 7-0 lead.

The Trojans tied the game with 58 seconds to play in the opening quarter as Watson found Khalil McClain for a 10-yard strike.

After Noel Ruiz drilled a 46-yard field goal to give Georgia State a 10-7 lead, Troy's defense scored on back-to-back possessions. Reddy Steward intercepted Brown and returned it 34 yards for a touchdown to give Troy a 14-10 lead. Just 38 seconds later, Shakel Brown picked up a Cornelious Brown fumble and returned it 21 yards to put the Trojans ahead 21-10 with 5:29 remaining in the second quarter.

Ruiz made his second field goal of the game, a 31-yard attempt, with 39 seconds to play in the second quarter to send the Panthers into the locker room trailing 21-13.

Troy drove to the GSU 8-yard line early in the third quarter when Lane picked off Free in the endzone, grabbing a ball that was tipped by cornerback Jaylon Jones early and returned it to the GSU 42-yard line.

Seven plays later Tucker Gregg rushed 27 yards for a touchdown and following the Ruiz extra point, the Panthers trailed by just one.

Brown found Carter again for a 36-yard touchdown to give Georgia State a 27-21 lead with 6:05 to play in the third quarter. It was Carter's ninth career touchdown reception.

On the next possession, Strachan forced Free to fumble and less than a minute later, Brown rushed two yards for a touchdown to put the Panthers ahead 33-21.

Free found A.J. Lewis for Troy's first offensive points since the first quarter with 13:29 to play in the game, cutting Georgia State's lead to 33-28.

Ruiz added his third field goal of the game, a 37-yard attempt, to push the lead back to eight with 6:54 to play.

Freshman Cameron Sims intercepted Free with just under six minutes to play, but the Trojans would get the ball back on a fumble and score a touchdown to pull within two. Then Free's two-point pass was incomplete.

"It's the maturation of a football team that believes they can win," Elliott said. "They kept believing. We gave up the touchdown but not the two-point conversion. Tonight, it didn't matter what the situation was, we stood tall."
