GEORGIA STATE (0-1) at No. 24/22 NORTH CAROLINA (0-1)

Saturday, Sept. 11 | 7:30 p.m. | ESPN3/Bally Sports South | Kenan Stadium

THE KICKOFF: Facing its first Power Five game since the historic 2019 win at Tennessee, Georgia State travels to nationally ranked North Carolina for the first time for a 7:30 p.m. game Saturday at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill, N.C. The game will be televised on ESPN3 and ACC RSN, including Bally Sports South in Atlanta.

> The Panthers (0-1) look to regroup after opening the season with a disappointing 43-10 loss to Army.

> North Carolina (0-1), ranked No. 10/9 (AP/Coaches) in the opening week, is also coming off an opening game loss, 17-10 at Virginia Tech.

> Coming off back-to-back bowl berths, Georgia State returns 22 starters from last year's LendingTree Bowl champions, including all 11 starters on offense and nine starters on defense as well as the punter and placekicker.

> Georgia State is opening the season with five straight games against teams that are ranked in the Top 25 or receiving votes.

PANTHERS vs. POWER FIVE: Georgia State is playing its first contest against a Power Five program since the Panthers' 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener, the program's first win over a Power Five team. (The scheduled 2020 game at Alabama was canceled.)

> In that Tennessee win, Georgia State trailed 17-14 at the half but outscored the Vols 24-13 in the second half. Tra Barnett's 19-yard run gave GSU a 28-23 lead, and then quarterback Dan Ellington sealed the win with a 22-yard touchdown run with five minutes left. Now Georgia State's running backs coach, Ellington also threw two TD passes in the game, and the GSU defense held Tennessee to 98 yards rushing.

> This is the first of two Power Five games this season for the Panthers, who will travel to Auburn on Sept. 25.

> The UNC game will be Georgia State's 12th game against an opponent from the Power Five, including games against ACC, SEC, Big Ten, Big 12 and Pac 12 foes. GSU is 0-2 vs. the ACC.

> North Carolina will play at Georgia State on Sept. 12, 2022, becoming the first Power Five program to play on the Panthers' home field.

> In the program's first 10 years of existence, the Panthers played at Alabama twice and at Tennessee twice, along with trips to West Virginia, Clemson, Washington, Oregon, Wisconsin, Penn State and NC State.

> Georgia State also has future games scheduled at South Carolina (2022), at LSU (2023), vs. Vanderbilt (home-and-home, 2024-2025), vs. Georgia Tech (home-and-home, 2024-2026), at Ole Miss (2026) and vs. Wake Forest (home-and-home, 2029-2030).

GEORGIA STATE vs. NORTH CAROLINA:

> Georgia State senior outside linebacker Jhi'Shawn Taylor is the older brother of UNC defensive lineman Jahlil Taylor. The brothers played at Crisp County High School in south Georgia.

> Georgia State backup inside linebacker Kyle Wright began his career with one season at North Carolina before transferring to GSU in 2019. Wright played in four games for UNC in 2018 and made two tackles.

> Three Panthers are from North Carolina, most notably super senior placekicker Noel Ruiz, a native of Wilson, N.C. (Fike H.S.) who began his career at North Carolina A&T. The roster also includes junior T.J. Smith (Laurinburg) and freshman Tylon Dunlap (Charlotte).

> The game features placekickers who are two of the top three active scorers in FBS. Georgia State's Noel Ruiz ranks third among active FBS kickers with 326 career points, and North Carolina's Grayson Atkins is second with 332 points. Four of Atkins' points came against Georgia State when he kicked for Furman in the Panthers' 48-42 win in 2019.

> Head coach Shawn Elliott is very familiar with UNC offensive line coach Stacy Searles, who was the o-line coach at Appalachian State when Elliott played defensive line for the Mountaineers. As a young coach at App State, Elliott spent two years as the tight ends coach working under Searles and then succeeded him as offensive line coach in 2001. Elliott also coached with UNC receivers coach Lonnie Galloway at App State.

> Safety Chris Moore, a grad transfer from Virginia, faced the Tar Heels in 2016 (loss), 2017 (win) and 2019 (win). In the Cavaliers' 20-14 win in 2017, Moore had six tackles, a TFL and an interception. He added three tackles and a pass breakup in a 38-31 win in 2019.

> Outside linebacker Shamar McCollum, in his first season at GSU after transferring from Wake Forest, faced the Tar Heels the last two years, including a 24-18 win in 2019. McCollum recorded a TFL against the Tar Heels in 2020, and he had a sack in Wake's 24-18 win in 2019.

GEORGIA STATE vs. RANKED TEAMS:

Georgia State is 0-8 all-time vs. ranked FBS teams, but five of the eight games have come against Power Five teams ranked 12th or higher in the AP poll.

Last season, the Panthers lost 34-31 in overtime to No. 19/21 Louisiana in the season opener. GSU also had a close call at No. 9 Wisconsin in 2016, leading 17-13 with less than 10 minutes to play before the Badgers scored the go-ahead touchdown with 7:25 left and went on to win 23-17.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: With all 11 offensive starters, back, Georgia State returns 97.6 percent of its offensive yardage from 2020, when the Panthers averaged 424.3 yards and a school-record 33.3 points per game. That includes 100 percent of GSU's passing yardage, 99.1 percent of its rushing yards and 96.4 percent of its receiving yards. Every player who scored a point returns.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Georgia State is facing the most challenging schedule in program history.

> The Panthers are facing seven teams that played in bowl games in 2020, including six foes who won eight or more games.

> Three GSU opponents were ranked in the Preseason Top 25: North Carolina (No. 10 AP/No. 9 Coaches), Louisiana (No. 23 AP & Coaches) and Coastal Carolina (No. 22 AP/No. 24 Coaches). Auburn (both), Army (both) and App State (Coaches) were receiving votes.

CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, scheduled to open in Fall 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

> GSU is one of just five Group of 5 teams with three preseason ranked opponents on its 2021 schedule. Two of the others are also in the Sun Belt in ULM and Arkansas State, along with Tulane and Tulsa.

> Georgia State is one of only three Group of 5 teams not playing an FCS team in 2021, along with Navy and Boise State.

> In addition to the challenging non-conference slate, Georgia State's Sun Belt schedule features the league's top two teams, Louisiana and Coastal Carolina, in back-to-back weeks, both on the road.

2020 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

> Georgia State won its final three games of 2020 and four its last five, capped by a victory over Western Kentucky in the LendingTree Bowl as the Panthers posted back-to-back winning seasons (6-4) and bowl appearances for the first time in program history.

> The Panthers averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game in 2020, and have scored 52 points, the program high against an FBS opponent, four times in the last two seasons, including twice in 2020.

> Two of GSU's four losses in 2020 came to nationally-ranked opponents, and the Panthers suffered three losses by a total of 14 points, each coming down to the final possession.

> Over the last three games of 2020, the GSU defense allowed an average of 18.3 points and 334.7 yards in wins over South Alabama (14 points, 324 yards) and Georgia Southern (24 points, 370 yards) and a three-point loss at App State (17 points, 310 yards).

> Georgia State ranked No. 7 in FBS with a school-record 35 sacks in 2020, including 21 over the last five games.

> GSU was No. 8 in FBS with 21 turnovers caused (12 interceptions, nine fumble recoveries), including two touchdowns.

> The GSU defense set a program record by allowing an average of 3.86 yards per rush. The Panthers' average of 136.7 rushing yards allowed is the second-best figure in school history.

> GSU placed a school-record 14 individuals on the All-Sun Belt Conference team, led by first-team selection Shamarius Gilmore. The senior left guard is the first GSU player to earn four straight all-conference honors.

SUPER SENIORS: Georgia State has six "super seniors" who have returned for an extra year of eligibility: LG Shamarius Gilmore, TE Roger Carter, NG Dontae Wilson, OLB DeAndre Bowman, PK Noel Ruiz, S Chris Moore. Gilmore (6th year), Bowman (6th), Carter (5th) and Wilson (5th) have spent their entire careers at GSU while Ruiz and Moore enrolled in 2020 as graduate transfers.

THREE STRAIGHT FOR 4: Quarterback Cornelious "Quad" Brown IV had a strong finish to the 2020 season, averaging 313 yards passing and 336 yards of total offense while completing 65 percent (63-97) of his passes in GSU's season-ending three-game winning streak. In all three games he directed comebacks:

> at South Alabama (W 31-14) - Brown (19-28, 334 yards passing, 31 yards rushing, 1 TD) directed four straight scoring drives for 24 straight points and completed his last 10 passes for 207 yards.

> vs. Georgia Southern (W 30-24) - Brown (28-39, career-high 372 yards passing, 1 TD passing, 1 TD rushing) rallied the Panthers from a 24-13 deficit with 17 straight fourth-quarter points and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run with 2:54 left.

> vs. WKU, LendingTree Bowl (W 39-21) - Brown (232 yards passing, 3 TD), the MVP, directed four straight touchdown drives over a 19-minute span to turn a 7-0 deficit into a 27-7 halftime lead.

CONSISTENT "LINE"UP: Georgia State's starting offensive line has combined for 142 career starts, led by left guard Shamarius Gilmore with 48 starts.

In that group, Gilmore, Sumter and Bartlett have started Georgia State's last 29 games.

After starting the same five offensive lineman in every game in 2019, the Panthers started the same five in every game but one in 2020.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In his 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons and 19 postseason appearances, including three bowl games in his four years at Georgia State.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons, 19 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games and winning seasons in three of his four years in Atlanta, including the first two bowl victories in program history.

Elliott and his staff navigated the unique challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season, capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first back-to-back winning records and bowl berths in school history as well as the program's highest winning percentage at .600.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks

with 35, another school record, and turnovers forced with 21. Along the way, a program-record 14 individuals earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors.

Other highlights of Elliott's first four years at GSU include the first bowl victory in school history, Georgia State's first winning season as an FBS program, and school-record seven-win campaigns in both 2017 and 2019.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a record-setting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark.

Bolstered by one of the top rushing attacks in the nation, the 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably

establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt Conference squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a school-record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is now with the Green Bay Packers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen.

Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist is GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Seattle Seahawks.

Individual honors in Elliott's first four seasons include 40 All-Sun Belt Conference honorees, Georgia State's first two players selected to the Reese's Senior Bowl, seven former players signed to NFL free agent contracts and a first-round selection in the CFL draft.

The accolades extend to the classroom with GSU's first Academic All-American® as well as five Academic All-District® selections. The Panthers posted a program-record 3.03 GPA in Elliott's first semester and nearly matched that with a 3.0 for the spring 2020 term.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach

five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-

American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a four-year letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

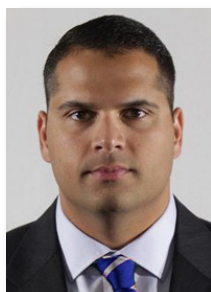

Georgia State fell to Army 43-10 Saturday at Center Parc Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Head coach Shawn Elliott got right to the point after the disappointing loss. "It all starts with the head coach, and the head coach did a very poor job of preparing our team," he said.

"We didn't play very well all the way around. It was an embarrassing effort, and I told our team, 'It falls on my shoulders.' I prepared the team, and it wasn't right the way, but we certainly know how to fix it. Our players understand what it's going to take change that mindset heading into next week."

Army executed its ball-control offense to perfection, collecting 258 yards rushing and four touchdowns, while the Panthers managed just 48 yards rushing and 129 yards passing in less than 18 minutes of possession time. Georgia State hurt itself with two turnovers and a couple of untimely penalties.

"Congratulations to Coach Monken and Army," Elliott continued. "This game was about toughness today, and you quickly saw who was the tougher team out there. We fumbled on our opening possession and things just went south from there."

After the Panthers' early fumble led to a 7-0 lead for Army, Georgia State had a chance to swing the momentum when Army fumbled a punt. In an unusual sequence of events, the Panthers recovered but were flagged for holding at the line of scrimmage. After the penalty, the ensuing punt was also fumbled and recovered by the Panthers, but that play, too, was nullified by another holding call. Army held onto the third punt.

"I don't think I've punted on a possession three times, recovered two fumbles and had two holding calls," said Elliott.

With GSU trailing 21-0 midway through the second quarter, the Panthers put together a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by Destin Coates' 16-yard touchdown run on the board with four minutes left in the half.

After forcing a punt, the Panthers took over at their own 7-yard line with 1:20 left, but quarterback Cornelius Brown IV was intercepted on the first play and Army tacked on another scored to take a 27-7 lead in the locker room.

One of the bright spots for the Georgia State offense was sophomore receiver Jamari Thrash, who stepped into the starting lineup and recorded career highs with seven receptions for 87 yards, including a spectacular one-handed grab on the Panthers' lone touchdown drive.

Coates scored his 16th career touchdown and finished with 48 yards, giving him an even 1,500 for his career and tying him with Travis Evans for second place in Georgia State history. Tra Barnett is the GSU career leader with 2,156 yards.

Super senior placekicker Noel Ruiz booted a 33-yard field goal, his ninth-straight field goal dating back to last season.

Brown was 12-for-20 for 129 yards passing.
