GEORGIA STATE (2-4, 1-1) vs. TEXAS STATE (2-4, 1-1)

Saturday, Oct. 23 | 2 p.m. | ESPN+ | Center Parc Stadium

THE KICKOFF: Georgia State returns to action to host Texas State for Homecoming at Center Parc Stadium.

> The Panthers, who had an open date on Oct. 16, are coming off one of the top offensive outputs in program history in a 55-21 victory at ULM. GSU scored a schoolrecord eight touchdowns while tying the program highs for points scored (55), margin of victory (34) and first downs (39). The offense piled up 572 total yards, including 326 yards on the ground, the fifth-best single-game in GSU annals.

> This is the Panthers' lone home game in a stretch of four out of five games on the road and Georgia State's only home date between Oct. 2 and Nov. 20. After Texas State, GSU will play three straight road games at Georgia Southern, Louisiana and Coastal Carolina.

SERIES vs. TEXAS STATE: Texas State holds a 4-3 margin in the series.

> The Panthers won three straight against Texas State from 2015-17, but the Bobcats have captured the last two games in 2018 and 2019. The two teams did not meet in 2020.

> The last meeting resulted in the longest game in GSU history as the Panthers fell 37-34 in triple overtime in San Marcos in 2019.

> Georgia State's last win in the series was a 33-30 victory at Texas State in 2017, a win that made the Panthers bowl eligible in head coach Shawn Elliott's first season.

RECORD-SETTING DAY FOR GRAINGER:

Quarterback Darren Grainger tied the GSU record by accounting for five touchdowns to lead the Panthers to a 55-21 win at ULM.

> Grainger, who passed for 230 yards and rushed for 84, threw two TD passes each to TE Aubry Payne and WR Ja'Cyais Credle and also scored on a 1-yard run.

> In his four starts, Grainger has thrown nine TD passes.

NO MATTER HOW YOU SAY IT: Although his last name is frequently mispronounced, there is no mistaking ILB Jordan Veneziale (ven-zee-AL) as Georgia State's leading tackler. The junior moved into the starting

end tandem Roger Carter (11, most by a GSU tight end) and Aubry Payne (8).

lineup in Game 2 vs. North Carolina, and for the season, he has collected 50 tackles, with 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. His average of 8.3 tackles per game ranks third in the Sun Belt.

ACADEMIC HONOR FOR JONES: Senior

cornerback Jaylon Jones was named a semifinalist for the 2021 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. Presented by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF), the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

> Jones is a three-year starter at cornerback who has excelled in the classroom, including President's List honors with a 4.0 GPA the last two semesters. He earned his bachelor's degree last spring and is now pursuing a master's in instructional technology and design.

DOWN TO THE WIRE: Those Playing its second nationally-ranked Power 5 opponent in three games, Georgia State battled No. 23 Auburn down to the wire, leading 24-19 until the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown on a fourth-down play with 45 seconds left.

> The Panthers rushed for 267 yards in the game, including a career-high 150 by Tucker Gregg, QB Darren Grainger, making his second start, rushed for 61 yards and threw TD passes to Jamari Thrash and Roger Carter.

> The GSU defense held Auburn to 167 yards rushing and did not allow an offensive touchdown until the game-winning drive.

IN A RUSH: The Georgia State has achieved two of the top eight rushing games in program history in the last four games, gaining 326 yards against ULM and 298 vs. Charlotte.

> The top five single-game rushing performances, and seven of the top eight, have come in the three seasons under offensive coordinator Brad Glenn (2019-present):

> In the win over ULM, the Panthers gained 326 yards on the ground, the fifth-best single-game in program history. QB Darren Grainger led the way with 84 yards, followed by Tucker Gregg (83) and Jamyest Williams (67).

> The Panthers rushed for 298 yards in their win over Charlotte, with four players gaining 60 or more yards: Destin Coates (83), Tucker Gregg (76), Jamyest Williams (73), QB Darren Grainger (64).

> Leading 13-9 with nine minutes to play, GSU forced a punt and took over at its own 10-yard line. The Panthers proceeded to eat up 7:20 on the clock by running 13 straight

CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49.000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, scheduled to open in Fall 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

times for 90 yards, capped by Williams' 13-yard TD with 1:38 left.

TUCKER THE TRUCKER: Senior running back Tucker Gregg, known for his hard-nosed style, rushed for a career-high 150 yards on just 12 carries at No. 23 Auburn.

> Gregg had a career-long 57-yard run to set up a score in the first quarter, and then a 50-yard touchdown run to put GSU ahead 24-10 late in the second quarter. He is the first Panther to have two runs of 50 or more yards in the same game.

> Gregg now has 957 career rushing yards to move into ninth place in GSU history.

ON GUARD: Super senior left guard Shamarious Gilmore, the veteran of the Georgia State program, played in his 53nd straight game against ULM. The four-time All-Sun Belt selection had his streak of 51 consecutive starts snapped against Appalachian State due to an injury, but he holds the school records for most games played and most starts.

ROGER THAT: Super senior tight end Roger Carter caught a 7-yard touchdown pass at Auburn for his 11th career touchdown reception. That gives him the GSU record for touchdowns by a tight end passing Keith Rucker (10, 2013-16).

> Carter has 84 career receptions for 986 yards, second to Rucker in both categories among all GSU tight ends.

MAY THE FOURTH BE WITH YOU: Senior running back Tucker Gregg had three fourthdown conversion runs in the second half of the win at Charlotte. One game earlier, he had two fourth-down conversions at North Carolina, giving him five in the two games.

THRASH, CREDLE EMERGE: With top receivers Sam Pinckney and Cornelius McCoy battling injuries, sophomores Jamari Thrash and Ja'Cyais Credle have stepped up.

> Thrash is the Panthers leading receiver with 17 catches for 220 yards, including a 35-yard TD catch vs. Charlotte and a 12-yard TD at Auburn.

> Credle, the transfer from UCF, has 14 catches for 21 yards. In the win over Charlotte, he had a 33-yard reception to set up a touchdown and then a 28-yard TD catch.

> Credle had his best game in the win at ULM, recording career highs with seven receptions for 130 yards, including touchdown catches of 31 and 38 yards.

SUPER SENIORS: Georgia State has six "super seniors" who have returned for an extra year of eligibility: LG Shamarious Gilmore, TE Roger Carter, NG Dontae Wilson, OLB DeAndre Bowman, PK Noel Ruiz, S Chris Moore. Gilmore (6th year), Bowman (6th), Carter (5th) and Wilson (5th) have spent their entire careers at GSU while Ruiz and Moore enrolled in 2020 as graduate transfers.

SCHEDULE NOTES: GSU's 2021 schedule is the most challenging in program history.

> The Panthers are facing seven teams that played in bowl games in 2020, including six foes who won eight or more games.

> Three GSU opponents were ranked in the Preseason Top 25: North Carolina (No. 10 AP/No. 9 Coaches), Louisiana (No. 23 AP & Coaches) and Coastal Carolina (No. 22 AP/No. 24 Coaches). Auburn (both), Army (both) and App State (Coaches) were receiving votes.

> GSU is one of just five Group of 5 teams with three preseason ranked opponents on its 2021 schedule. Two of the others are also in the Sun Belt in ULM and Arkansas State, along with Tulane and Tulsa.

> Georgia State is one of only three Group of 5 teams not playing an FCS team in 2021, along with Navy and Boise State.

> In addition to the challenging non-conference slate, Georgia State's Sun Belt schedule features the two of the league's top teams, Louisiana and Coastal Carolina, in back-toback weeks, both on the road.

2020 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

> Georgia State won its final three games of 2020 and four its last five, capped by a victory over Western Kentucky in the LendingTree Bowl as the Panthers posted back-toback winning seasons (6-4) and bowl appearances for the first time in program history.

> The Panthers averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game in 2020, and have scored 52 points, the program high against an FBS opponent, four times in the last two seasons, including twice in 2020.

> Two of GSU's four losses in 2020 came to nationally-ranked opponents, and the Panthers suffered three losses by a total of 14 points, each coming down to the final possession.

> Over the last three games of 2020, the GSU defense allowed an average of 18.3 points and 334.7 yards in wins over South Alabama (14 points, 324 yards) and Georgia Southern (24 points, 370 yards) and a three-point loss at App State (17 points, 310 yards).

> Georgia State ranked No. 7 in FBS with a school-record 35 sacks in 2020, including 21 over the last five games.

> GSU was No. 8 in FBS with 21 turnovers caused (12 interceptions, nine fumble recoveries), including two touchdowns.

> The GSU defense set a program record by allowing an average of 3.86 yards per rush. The Panthers' average of 136.7 rushing yards allowed is the second-best figure in school history.

> GSU placed a school-record 14 individuals on the All-Sun Belt Conference team, led by first-team selection Shamarious Gilmore. The senior left guard is the first GSU player to earn four straight all-conference honors.

CONSISTENT "LINE" UP: Georgia State's

starting offensive line has combined for 165 career starts, led by left guard Shamarious Gilmore with 52 starts.

COATES RUSHES UP RUSHING LIST:

Senior running back Destin Coates has 1,638 career rushing yards to rank second in GSU history. The Georgia State record is 2,156 yards by Tra Barnett (2016-19). Coates also ranks second to Barnett with 16 rushing touchdowns.

Last season, Coates earned All-Sun Belt honors with 769 yards and seven touchdowns in nine games.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In his 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons and 19 postseason appearances, including three bowl games in his four years at Georgia State.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons, 19 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games and winning seasons in three of his four years in Atlanta, including the first two bowl victories in program history.

Elliott and his staff navigated the unique challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season, capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first back-toback winning records and bowl berths in school history as well as the program's highest winning percentage at .600.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks

with 35, another school record, and turnovers forced with 21. Along the way, a programrecord 14 individuals earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors.

Other highlights of Elliott's first four years at GSU include the first bowl victory in school history, Georgia State's first winning season as an FBS program, and school-record seven-win campaigns in both 2017 and 2019.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a recordsetting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark.

Bolstered by one of the top rushing attacks in the nation, the 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably

establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt Conference squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a school-record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is now with the Green Bay Packers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen.

Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist is GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Seattle Seahawks.

Individual honors in Elliott's first four seasons include 40 All-Sun Belt Conference honorees, Georgia State's first two players selected to the Reese's Senior Bowl, seven former players signed to NFL free agent contracts and a first-round selection in the CFL draft.

The accolades extend to the classroom with GSU's first Academic All-American^{*} as well as five Academic All-District^{*} selections. The Panthers posted a program-record 3.03 GPA in Elliott's first semester and nearly matched that with a 3.0 for the spring 2020 term.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach

five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached AllAmerican and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a fouryear letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.



Georgia State fell to Army 43-10 Saturday at Center Parc Stadium in the season opener for both teams

Head coach Shawn Elliott got right to the point after the disappointing loss. "It all starts with the head coach, and the head coach did a very poor job of preparing our team," he said.

'We didn't play very well all the way around. It was an embarrassing effort, and I told our team, 'It falls on my shoulders.' I prepared the team, and it wasn't right the way, but we certainly know how to fix it. Our players understand what it's going to take change that mindset heading into next week."

Army executed its ball-control offense to perfection, collecting 258 yards rushing and four touchdowns, while the Panthers managed just 48 yards rushing and 129 yards passing in less than 18 minutes of possession time. Georgia State hurt itself with two turnovers and a couple of untimely penalties.

"Congratulations to Coach Monken and Army," Elliott continued. "This game was about toughness today, and you quickly saw who was the tougher team out there. We fumbled on our opening possession and things just went south from there.

After the Panthers' early fumble led to a 7-0 lead for Army, Georgia State had a chance to swing the momentum when Army fumbled a punt. In an unusual sequence of events, the Panthers recovered but were flagged for holding at the line of scrimmage. After the penalty, the ensuing punt was also fumbled and recovered by the Panthers, but that play, too, was nullified by another holding call. Army held onto the third punt.

"I don't think I've punted on a possession three times, recovered two fumbles and had two holding calls," said Elliott.

With GSU trailing 21-0 midway through the second quarter, the Panthers put together a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by Destin Coates' 16-yard touchdown run on the board with four minutes left in the half.

After forcing a punt, the Panthers took over at their own 7-yard line with 1:20 left, but quarterback Cornelius Brown IV was intercepted on the first play and Army tacked on another scored to take a 27-7 lead in the locker room.

One of the bright spots for the Georgia State offense was sophomore receiver Jamari Thrash, who stepped into the starting lineup and recorded career highs with seven receptions for 87 yards, including a spectacular one-handed grab on the Panthers' lone touchdown drive.

Coates scored his 16th career touchdown and finished with 48 yards, giving him an even 1,500 for his career and tying him with Travis Evans for second place in Georgia State history. Tra Barnett is the GSU career leader with 2,156 yards.

Super senior placekicker Noel Ruiz booted a 33-yard field goal, his ninth-straight field goal dating back to last season.

Brown was 12-for-20 for 129 yards passing.

NORTH CAROLINA 59, GEORGIA STATE 17

Game 2: Sept. 11, 2021 • 7:30 p.m. (RSN/ESPN3) Kenan Stadium • Chapel Hill, N.C.

Georgia State fell at No. 22 North Carolina 59-17 at Kenan Stadium.

Trailing 14-0 in the first quarter, Georgia State got some momentum when Dontae Wilson recovered a fumble at the UNC 19-yard line, setting up a 37-yard field goal by Noel Ruiz. Playing in his home state, the Wilson, N.C. native connected for the 10th straight time to put the Panthers on the board at 14-3 with 3:28 to play in the first quarter.

The Panthers put together a 17-play, 75-yard drive that ate up 7:30 on the clock in the second quarter. Tucker Gregg kept the drive alive with a fourth-down conversion on a 6-yard run to the UNC 21. Three plays later, guarterback Cornelius Brown rushed for a 4-yard touchdown to make the score 21-10 with six minutes left in the half.

Georgia State went into the half trailing 24-10, and it was still a two-possession game with six minutes to play in the third quarter, but the Tar Heels scored four-straight touchdowns, including three over a 5:24 stretch in the third guarter.

There were times in that football game when we looked really sharp," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "In that second quarter, I was really pleased. We were playing with momentum and with effort and enthusiasm, and it's 24-10 at the half. Then we come out there in the third guarter and within the blink of an eye, it's out of hand. It's really disappointing."

Brown finished the game going 12-for-26 for 68 yards as the Panthers pounded the ball on the ground, finishing with 181 yards to hold the edge in the time of possession 30:17 to 29:43.

"At times we controlled the line of scrimmage and ran the ball well, getting four or five yards a clip. But when you're playing a team that's scoring as quickly as they did, it's hard to keep doing that," Elliott said. "We've got to have a combination of run and pass to be successful. We've got to improve.

"We didn't throw the ball and we didn't catch very well," he continued. "There were some great opportunities to make some big plays down the field, but we missed some throws and had some drops. Throwing and catching is something we do every single day, and for whatever reason, we missed it tonight.

Back-up guarterback Darren Grainger played the fourth quarter and rushed for 53 yards on four attempts, including a 36-yard scamper down to the 2-yard line. Tucker Gregg ran seven times for 31 yards, including two fourth-down conversions, while Marcus Carroll rushed six times and scored a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Sam Howell, a preseason Heisman Trophy candidate, led North Carolina, ranked No. 22 in the coaches poll and No. 24 by AP. Howell was 21-of-29 passing for 352 yards and three touchdowns, and on the ground, he rushed 11 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns.

"There's a reason why he has the talk of being the top quarterback in college football and the top pick in the NFL Draft," Elliott said..

GEORGIA STATE 20, CHARLOTTE 9

Game 3: Sept. 18, 2021 • 7 p.m. (ESPN+) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State piled up 298 yards rushing to back an outstanding performance by the defense as the Panthers earned their first victory of the season by defeating previously unbeaten Charlotte 20-9 Saturday night at Center Parc Stadium.

Georgia State (1-2) controlled the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball as the GSU defense held the 49ers (2-1) to just 276 total yards, the seventh-lowest figure in program history and lowest since holding ULM to 262 yards in 2018.

Making his first start for the Panthers, quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 139 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 64 yards. The junior transfer threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash and a 28-yard scoring strike to Ja'Cyais Credle.

Senior running back Tucker Gregg pounded out 76 yards on 22 carries, while senior Jamyest Williams added 73 yards on just seven carries and scored his first career touchdown on a 13-yard run to seal the win with 1:38 left. Destin Coates gained 83 yards, the bulk of it on a 64-yard run.

"This win happened exactly the way we needed it to," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It was a tough contest. We really had to fight and claw. It wasn't easy by any means, but I'm very pleased with the way we did it. "A phenomenal defensive effort. Our defense

"A phenomenal defensive effort. Our defense was all over the place. They were relentless. A strong running game and a great defense makes for a happy football coach," Elliott said

After allowing a safety, Georgia State trailed 9-7 midway through the third quarter when Grainger directed a 6-play, 66-yard scoring drive, capped by his 28-yard TD to Credle. That gave the Panthers their first lead at 13-9 with five minutes left in the third quarter.

Charlotte drove deep into GSU territory, but Blake Carroll caused a fumble that Chris Bacon recovered for the Panthers at the GSU 13-yard line to end the threat.

Carroll, the senior linebacker, led the Panthers with nine tackles, including a sack, plus a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

Gregg converted three fourth-down plays with short runs, giving him five fourth-down conversions

in the last two games.

Georgia State started its game-clinching drive with nine minutes to play after taking over at its own 10-yard line. The 13-play, 90-yard drive was all on the ground and ate up 7:20 on the clock. Gregg and Grainger got the Panthers out to midfield, and then Williams finished the drive with an 11-yard run to the Charlotte 41, a 31-yard gain to the 13 and then a 13-yard touchdown run.

With Georgia State trailing 7-0 late in the second quarter, Grainger directed his first touchdown drive for the Panthers. After a punt, GSU took over at its own 32, and on the first play, Grainger hooked up with Ja'Cyais Credle for a 33-yard completion down the right sideline. On the next play, he found Jamari Thrash down the left side for a 35-yard touchdown, tying the score at 7-all with four minutes left in the first half.

Charlotte's first score was set up by a GSU fumble. Destin Coates broke through the line and raced 64 yards, but he was brought down at the 10-yard line and Charlotte knocked the ball out, and Shedrick Ursery recovered for the 49ers. That led to Chris Reynolds 36-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Spencer 7:41 left in the second quarter.

AUBURN 34, GEORGIA STATE 24

Game 4: Sept. 25, 2021 • 4 p.m. ET (SECN) Jordan-Hare Stadium • Auburn, Ala.

Georgia State battled No. 23 Auburn for 59 minutes but the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown on a fourth-down play with 45 seconds left and went on to win 34-24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Georgia State (1-3) took the lead early in the second quarter and still led 24-19 when Auburn took over at its own 2-yard line with 3:23 to play. The Tigers (3-1) were able to move down the field but faced 4th-and-9 at the GSU 10 when quarterback T.J. Finley scrambled and then found Shedrick Jackson in the end zone for the go-ahead score. That was the only offensive touchdown that Auburn managed against the GSU defense.

"I think our football team played one unbelievable contest," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They played as hard as they could. They fought, dug, clawed, and it's amazing that it came down to one fourth-down play.

"I couldn't be more of proud of them," Elliott continued. "The wins, for me, are about seeing their faces, so tonight it was disappointing to walk in there and see a team that had given everything they had but came up on the short end. Sports can rip you apart. That was a tough one to lose, but we'll bounce back. We've had a tough non-conference schedule, and we've got to gain confidence from coming down here and playing so hard and playing so well, but it's hard to lose."

Tucker Gregg rushed for a career-high 150 yards, including a 5-yard touchdown run, and quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 117 yards and two touchdowns. Linebacker Jordan Veneziale led the outstanding performance by the GSU defense with seven tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery.

"Our entire defense played one helluva game," Elliott said. "Time and time and time again, stop after stop. They controlled the line of scrimmage and they controlled the passing game. It was fun to watch.

"That's two weeks in a row, and if they continue to play like that, we've got one heckuva chance."

The Panthers got on the scoreboard first as Gregg's career-long 57-yard run set up Noel Ruiz's 32-yard field goal midway through the first quarter, the 11th straight make for the senior.

Auburn managed a pair of field goals before Georgia State took its first lead early in the second quarter. Grainger directed a 16-play, 75-yard drive, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash, putting the Panthers up 10-6 with 12:45 left in the second quarter.

After an Auburn field goal cut the GSU lead to 10-9, the Panthers embarked on another 75-yard scoring drive, this time needing only five plays. After Williams started the drive with an 18-yard run, Grainger hit tight end Roger Carter for a 24-yard completion down the left sideline and rushed 11 yards for a first down at the Auburn 7. On the next play, Grainger found Carter in the end zone for the 7-yard scoring pass and the 11th career touchdown catch for Carter, who surpassed Keith Rucker for the most ever by a GSU tight end. That put the Panthers up 17-9 with seven minutes left in the half.

The Georgia State defense again held Auburn to a field goal, and after a penalty on the kickoff return, the Panthers took over at their 40. After one first down put the ball at the 50, Gregg took the handoff and broke through the middle, outracing the defense for a 50-yard touchdown run, giving Georgia State a 24-12 half-time lead.

The 50-yard run gave Gregg 142 for the first half, the most rushing yards that Auburn has allowed to any running back in the first half since LSU's Leonard Fournette gained 169 in 2015, and the

Georgia State fell to Appalachian State 45-16 in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

The Panthers (1-4, 0-1 Sun Belt) trailed 14-9 midway through the third quarter when App State (4-1, 1-0) connected on a 79-yard touchdown pass. Georgia State was still within striking distance, down 24-9, late in the third, but the Mountaineers scored three straight touchdowns to pull away.

"It snowballed on us there in the second half, and it's a very disappointing feeling," GSU head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We've got to do a lot of soul-searching. We've got to figure some things out because it certainly didn't end the way we wanted."

One bright spot for the Panthers was placekicker Noel Ruiz, who booted field goals of 23, 32, and 22 yards. The super senior from Wilson, N.C., has now made a school-record 14-straight field goals.

"You've probably heard me say that you don't win games by kicking field goals, but we were playing so well defensively and keeping it close, that I thought, Let's take the field goal and get those points," Elliott explained.

"Noel is a great kicker, but we've got to punch those things in. You can't leave the ball on the 10, the 15, the 5-yard line. It's very important that you score touchdowns in the red zone."

GSU started slowly on offense as quarterback Darren Grainger threw an interception on the first drive, setting up App State's first touchdown, a 23-yard scoring run by Sun Belt rushing leader Nate Noel.

Cornelious Brown IV replaced Grainger on the third series and led the Panthers down the field for the three field goals. Brown finished 16-31 for 171 yards but threw two interceptions. Grainger finished the game with a late 66-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman Tailique Williams.

"We went into the game thinking we were going to play both quarterbacks," Elliott said. "We knew we had to get our throwing game going. We felt like we would have to throw it more in this contest to move the football."

Running back Jamyest Williams rushed for 41 yards on eight carries, along with a 19-yard reception. Marcus Carroll rushed nine times for 46 yards in the fourth quarter. Sam Pinckney and Cornelius McCoy led the receivers with four catches each.

"I really thought we played defensively until late in the third quarter," Elliott said. "I was proud of our defense. And I'm still proud of our defense, but I'm not proud of how we finished the game defensively, offensively or anything else. But the defense was giving us opportunities to get the ball back and score, and ultimately we could not do that."

GEORGIA STATE 55, ULM 21

Game 6: Oct. 9, 2021 • 8 p.m. ET (ESPN3) Malone Stadium • Monroe, La.

Darren Grainger threw four touchdown passes and rushed for a fifth score as Georgia State tied the school record for points in a 55-21 Sun Belt Conference victory at ULM.

Fifty-five points are the most the Panthers (2-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) have scored against an FBS opponent and equal the overall record, set vs. Savannah State in the inaugural season of 2010. Georgia State's 34-point margin of victory also ties a program record achieved four other times.

"We passed the test and played all four quarters," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I told them at halftime that we had a test in the second half to see if we could keep the momentum and the concentration, and we did exactly that. These guys did a great job. Anytime you come on the road and get a conference win, it's a good thing."

Grainger passed for 230 yards and rushed for 84 more as the Panthers piled up 572 yards of offense, including 326 yards on the ground. The junior signal caller tied the GSU record by accounting for five touchdowns.

Tight end Aubry Payne and wide receiver Ja'Cyais Credle caught two touchdowns apiece, while Jamyest Williams (67 yards on 12 carries), Tucker Gregg (83 yards on 15 carries) and Cornelious Brown IV added rushing scores.

Credle, the sophomore transfer, had spectacular touchdown catches of 31 and 38 yards and finished

with seven catches for 130 yards, both career highs. Payne also registered his high marks with six receptions for 58 yards, including scoring plays of 10 and nine yards.

Georgia State jumped in front by scoring 28 points in the first half. Williams started the scoring with a 1-yard scoring run, capping a 10-play, 75-yard drive to tie the game at 7-all with 6:35 play left in the first quarter.

Grainger punctuated the next two long scoring marches with touchdown passes, hitting tight end Aubry Payne from 10 yards and then connecting with Ja'Cyais Credle for 31-yards scoring strike to give GSU a 21-7 lead with four minutes left in the half.

The GSU defense got the ball back two plays later as safety Jalen Tate forced a fumble that defensive end Javon Denis recovered at the ULM 34-yard line. Gregg found the end zone from two yards out for a 28-7 advantage going into the half.

The Panthers collected 19 first downs and piled up 208 yards on the ground in the first half.

Georgia State took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 75 yards on eight plays, finishing the drive with Payne's second touchdown catch.

After ULM (2-3, 1-2 Sun Belt) scored to pull within 35-21, the Panthers answered with three straight touchdowns.

"Óffensively, we were in sync all night," Elliott said. "Our backs ran hard, the offensive line and tight ends and Grainger did a great job."

Sophomore safety Antavious Lane grabbed his fifth career interception. Linebacker Blake Carroll led the defense with eight tackles and one tackle for loss, and defensive end Jeffery Clark had two tackles for loss, including one sack.
