GEORGIA STATE (6-5, 5-2) vs. TROY (5-6, 3-4)

Saturday, Nov. 27 | 2 p.m. | ESPN+ | Center Parc Stadium

THE KICKOFF: Bowl eligible for the third straight year, Georgia State concludes the regular season Saturday at Center Parc Stadium, hosting Troy in a 2 p.m. kickoff on Senior Day.

> Fueled by a dominating defensive effort, Georgia State downed Arkansas State 28-20 to improve to 6-5 overall and 5-2 in the Sun Belt.

> The Panthers have won five of their last six games, with the only loss in that stretch a 21-17 defeat at No. 24 Louisiana in which GSU led until the final three minutes. Three of those five wins have been on the road.

> Georgia State is the ONLY FBS team in the nation to play four road games against ranked opponents this season.

> Georgia State's five Sun Belt wins equal the program record, also achieved in 2015 and 2017.

> The Panthers rank No. 13 in FBS in rushing, averaging 222.5 ypg.

> The running back tandem of Tucker Gregg (816 yds, 10 TD) and Jamyest Williams (702 yds, 7 TD) has the topped the 1,000-yard mark for the season, combing for 1,518 yards and 17 TDs. QB Darren Grainger adds 501 yards rushing and two TDs.

BOWLING 'EM OVER: Georgia State is bowl eligible for the third straight year for the first time in program history.

> The Panthers have earned bowl eligibility four times in five seasons under head coach Shawn Elliott.

> Playing just its 12th season of football, Georgia State is bowl eligible for the fifth time since earning full FBS status in 2014.

DOMINATING DEFENSIVE EFFORT:

Georgia State rushed for 282 yards, including a career-high 125 yards and two touchdowns by Jamyest Williams, but dominating defense was story of the Panthers' 28-20 win over Arkansas State.

> The Panthers held Arkansas State to just 270 total yards, the sixth-lowest figure in program history and the fourth game in the last two seasons in which GSU has held a team under 300 yards.

> GSU set a school record by holding the

GSU career record for interceptions that Quavian White and Antavious Lane have tied in the last two games.

Red Wolves to minus-3 yards rushing. The previous record was minus-2 yards by WKU in the 2017 Cure Bowl.

> School-record 15 tackles for loss, including six sacks. OLB Jontrey Hunter tied the GSU record with four TFL.

RANK THAT: After coming oh-so-close in games at No. 23 Auburn and No. 24 Louisiana, Georgia State broke through to earn the program's first-ever win over a ranked opponent, 42-40 at No. 22/21 Coastal Carolina.

> Playing in his hometown, quarterback Darren Grainger, the Conway, S.C., native, passed for 198 yards and two touchdowns, including the go-ahead 2-yard TD pass to Terrance Dixon with five minutes left. He was named Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week.

> Jamyest Williams (83 yards, 1 TD) and Tucker Gregg (67 yards, 3 TD) combined for 150 yards rushing and four touchdowns.

> The Georgia State defense stopped Coastal's attempt at the game-tying 2-point conversion with 1:09 left as NG Thomas Gore tackled RB Shermari Jones shy of the goal line. The Panthers recovered the ensuing onside kick to preserve the win.

> Facing its fourth ranked opponent of the season GSU snapped Coastal Carolina's 12-game home winning streak and knocked the Chanticleers out of the polls after 22 straight weeks.

THROWN FOR A LOSS: The Georgia State defense ranks No. 14 in FBS with a school-record 76 tackles for loss.

> The total includes 29 sacks, the program's second-best season total. The 2020 Panthers set the school record with 35 sacks.

> The Panthers have made 26 tackles behind the line of scrimmage over the last games.

THE SERIES: Troy enters the game at 5-6, 3-4 Sun Belt as interim head coach Brandon Hall makes his debut.

> Troy leads the series 5-3, but Georgia State has won the last two meetings. The Panthers first defeated Troy in 2015.

> In last year's 36-34 win at Troy, TE Roger Carter caught two touchdown passes and

the GSU defense held Troy to just 40 yards rushing, now the third-lowest figure in school history.

> In 2019 in Atlanta, the Panthers rushed for a then-school record 390 yards, including 242 yards by Tra Barnett, in their 52-33 win.

> Troy is the only Sun Belt team that the Panthers have played every year since joining the league in 2013.

WILLIS & WILSON: Senior DE Hardrick Willis is Georgia State's career leader in sacks with 12.5, but super senior NG Dontae Wilson is gaining on him.

> With a sack in the win over Arkansas State, Wilson now ranks second with 11.0 career sacks.

> Wilson also tied Michael Shaw for the GSU career record with 26.5 tackles for loss.

TUCKER THE TRUCKER: Senior running back Tucker Gregg, known for his hard-nosed style, has trucked his way to 1,423 career rushing yards to rank No. 4 in GSU history.

> The former walk-on and Burlsworth Trophy nominee is second in the Sun Belt with 816 yards this season and fourth with nine rushing touchdowns. His 816 represent the No. 2 season total in GSU history.

> Gregg is coming off a 98-yard effort vs. Arkansas State, including two crucial thirddown conversions to allow the Panthers to run out the clock.

> He tied the GSU record with three rushing touchdowns, along with 67 yards, in the win at No. 22/21 Coastal Carolina.

> Gregg rushed for 99 yards at No. 24 Louisiana, including a 1-yard touchdown that gave GSU a 17-14 lead with five minutes left. He gained 48 yards on that drive alone.

> He rushed for 87 yards and two TDs in the Panthers' 21-14 win over Georgia Southern, and 98 yards and one score in win over Arkansas State. **CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM** is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, scheduled to open in Fall 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

> Gregg rushed for a career-high 150 yards on 12 carries at No. 23 Auburn. He had a career-long 57-yard run to set up a score in the first quarter, and then a 50-yard TD run to put GSU ahead 24-10 late in the second quarter. He is the first Panther to have two runs of 50 or more yards in the same game.

JAM-MING: Jamyest Williams is the Panthers' second-leading rusher with 702 yards and eight touchdowns.

> He leads the Panthers with 6.7 yards per carry, which would rank No. 6 in FBS, but he is just under the minimum number of attempts to be ranked.

> Over the last five games, Williams is averaging 92.6 yards per game and 7.5 yards per carry with six touchdowns.

> He has rushed for 955 yards and eight touchdowns in 19 games on offense.

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL: Long-snapper Seth Glausier was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team for the second straight year and is now eligible for the 2021 Academic All-America team. The junior from Jefferson, Ga., maintains a 3.99 GPA while majoring in managerial sciences.

LANE, WHITE TIE INTERCEPTION

RECORD: In the last two games, cornerback Quavian White and safety Antavious Lane have tied the Georgia State career record of seven interceptions, originally set by current Green Bay Packer CB Chandon Sullivan.

> White got No. 7 in the Panthers' win at No. 22/21 Coastal Carolina. He returned his interception 36 yards to the 1-yard line to set up a touchdown that gave the Panthers their first lead in the game. He also had two pass breakups in the win.

> White is also GSU's career leader with 31 passes defended (interceptions plus pass breakups and 120 interception return yards.

> Lane followed with his seventh pick in the win over Arkansas State, when he also had a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and two pass breakups.

ROGER THAT: Super senior tight end Roger Carter is Georgia State's career leader in receptions (95), receiving yards (1,211) and touchdown receptions (12) by a tight end.

> Among all players, Carter is eighth in receiving yards, ninth in receptions and tied for fourth in touchdown receptions.

> Carter and fellow tight end Aubry Payne have combined for 22 career touchdowns.

DOWN TO THE WIRE: Before breaking through against No. 21/22 Coastal Carolina, Georgia State held late leads at No. 23 Auburn and at No. 24 Louisiana.

> The Panthers led 24-19 at No. 23 Auburn until the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown on a fourth-down play with 45 seconds left. > The Panthers rushed for 267 yards in the game, including a career-high 150 by Tucker Gregg.

> The GSU defense held Auburn to 167 yards rushing and did not allow an offensive touchdown until the game-winning drive.

> Georgia State took a 17-14 lead at No. 24 Louisiana on Tucker Gregg's 1-yard TD run with 5:25 left, but the Ragin' Cajuns won 21-17 on a touchdown with 2:32 to play.

TACKLE BOX: ILB Jordan Veneziale (venzee-AL) as Georgia State's leading tackler. The junior moved into the starting lineup in Game 2 vs. North Carolina, and for the season, he has collected 71 tackles, with 4.5 tackles for loss, three sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. His average of 7.9 tackles per game ranks third in the Sun Belt.

#STATENOTSOUTHERN: Georgia State scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns, including Jamyest Williams' game-winner on a 23-yard run with 26 seconds left, to earn a 21-14 victory at Georgia Southern.

> After Georgia Southern tied the game with 1:39 left, the Panthers drove 73 yards in seven plays for the winning score. Williams started the drive with a 12-yard run, and QB Darren Grainger had a 5-yard completion and five rushes for 35 yards.

> The defense had to make one last stand after Georgia Southern drove to the GSU 21 with two seconds left, but Jhi'Shawn Taylor sacked QB Justin Tomlin on the final play.

> The Panthers defeated their in-state rival for the second straight year and improved to 5-3 in the series.

> In Georgia State's last three wins in the series, the Panthers have scored a late touchdown to win. In 2020's 30-24 victory, Cornelious Brown IV scored on a 1-yard run with 2:54 left, and in 2017, Penny Hart caught a 9-yard TD pass from Conner Manning with 2:31 to play for a 21-17 victory.

RECORD-SETTING WIN AT ULM: The Panthers produced one of the top offensive outputs in program history in their 55-21 victory at ULM. GSU scored a school-record eight touchdowns while tying the program highs for points scored (55), margin of victory (34) and first downs (39). The offense piled up 572 total yards, including 326 yards on the ground, the fifth-best single-game in GSU annals.

> Quarterback Darren Grainger tied the GSU record by accounting for five touchdowns while passing for 230 yards and rushing for 84. He threw two TD passes each to TE Aubry Payne and WR Ja'Cyais Credle and also scored on a 1-yard run.

IN A RUSH: The Georgia State has achieved four of the top 10 rushing games in program history in the last nine games, gaining 326 yards against ULM and 298 vs. Charlotte, 283 vs. Texas State and 282 vs. Arkansas State.

> The top five single-game rushing performances, and eight of the top 10, have come in the three seasons under offensive coordinator Brad Glenn (2019-present):

- 414 ULM, 2019
- 390 Troy, 2019350 Coastal Carolina, 2019
- 340 Arkansas State, 2019
- 326 ULM, 2021
- 308 ULM, 2018
- 301 Campbell, 2011
- 298 Charlotte, 2021
- 283 Texas State, 2021
- 282 Arkansas State, 2021

> In the win over ULM, the Panthers gained 326 yards, the fifth-best single-game in program history. QB Darren Grainger led the way with 84 yards, followed by Tucker Gregg (83) and Jamyest Williams (67).

> Against Texas State, it was Gregg (115), Grainger (91) and Williams (77) again.

> The Panthers rushed for 298 yards in their win over Charlotte, with four players gaining 60 or more yards: Destin Coates (83), Gregg (76), Williams (73) and Grainger (64).

> Leading 13-9 with nine minutes to play vs. Charlotte, GSU forced a punt and took over at its own 10-yard line. The Panthers proceeded to eat up 7:20 on the clock by running 13 straight times for 90 yards, capped by Williams' 13-yard TD with 1:38 left.

ON GUARD: Super senior left guard Shamarious Gilmore, the veteran of the Georgia State program, played in his 58th straight game against Coastal Carolina, including 57 starts. The four-time All-Sun Belt selection had his streak of 51 consecutive starts snapped against Appalachian State due to an injury, but he holds the school records for most games played and most starts.

MAY THE FOURTH BE WITH YOU: Senior running back Tucker Gregg has converted sixth fourth-down runs into first downs.

> Against Texas State, with the Panthers holding a just a 14-13 lead and facing 4th-and-1 at the GSU 42, Gregg took the handoff up the middle and appeared to be stuffed at the line of scrimmage, but he bounced outside and raced 14 yards around the right end for the first down. Three plays later, Georgia State scored a touchdown to go up 21-13. > Gregg had three fourth-down conversion runs in the second half of the win at Charlotte. One game earlier, he had two fourthdown conversions at North Carolina, giving him five in the two games.

ACADEMIC HONOR FOR JONES: Senior

cornerback Jaylon Jones was named a semifinalist for the 2021 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. Presented by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF), the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

> Jones is a three-year starter at cornerback who has excelled in the classroom, including President's List honors with a 4.0 GPA the last two semesters. He earned his bachelor's degree last spring and is now pursuing a master's in instructional technology and design.

SUPER SENIORS: Georgia State has five "super seniors" who have returned for an extra year of eligibility: LG Shamarious Gilmore, TE Roger Carter, NG Dontae Wilson, PK Noel Ruiz, S Chris Moore. Gilmore (6th year), Carter (5th) and Wilson (5th) have spent their entire careers at GSU while Ruiz and Moore enrolled in 2020 as graduate transfers.

SCHEDULE NOTES: GSU's 2021 schedule is the most challenging in program history.

> The Panthers are facing seven teams that played in bowl games in 2020, including six foes who won eight or more games.

> Three GSU opponents were ranked in the Preseason Top 25: North Carolina (No. 10 AP/No. 9 Coaches), Louisiana (No. 23 AP & Coaches) and Coastal Carolina (No. 22 AP/No. 24 Coaches). Auburn (both), Army (both) and App State (Coaches) were receiving votes.

> Georgia State is one of only three Group of 5 teams not playing an FCS team in 2021, along with Navy and Boise State.

2020 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

> Georgia State won its final three games of 2020 and four its last five, capped by a victory over Western Kentucky in the LendingTree Bowl as the Panthers posted back-to-back winning seasons (6-4) and bowl appearances for the first time in program history.

> The Panthers averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game in 2020

> Two of GSU's four losses in 2020 came to nationally-ranked opponents, and the Panthers suffered three losses by a total of 14 points, each coming down to the final possession.

> Georgia State ranked No. 7 in FBS with a school-record 35 sacks in 2020, including 21 over the last five games.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In his 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons and 19 postseason appearances, including three bowl games in his four years at Georgia State.

A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Shawn Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by President Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State, where he coached the offensive line.

In 24 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 21 winning seasons, 19 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games and winning seasons in three of his four years in Atlanta, including the first two bowl victories in program history.

Elliott and his staff navigated the unique challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season, capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first back-toback winning records and bowl berths in school history as well as the program's highest winning percentage at .600.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks

with 35, another school record, and turnovers forced with 21. Along the way, a programrecord 14 individuals earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors.

Other highlights of Elliott's first four years at GSU include the first bowl victory in school history, Georgia State's first winning season as an FBS program, and school-record seven-win campaigns in both 2017 and 2019.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a recordsetting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark.

Bolstered by one of the top rushing attacks in the nation, the 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably

establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt Conference squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a school-record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

Under Elliott's watch, the Panthers achieved benchmark performances on both sides of the ball. The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4). The defense also recorded the first shutout in school history.

On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is now with the Green Bay Packers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen.

Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist is GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Seattle Seahawks.

Individual honors in Elliott's first four seasons include 40 All-Sun Belt Conference honorees, Georgia State's first two players selected to the Reese's Senior Bowl, seven former players signed to NFL free agent contracts and a first-round selection in the CFL draft.

The accolades extend to the classroom with GSU's first Academic All-American^{*} as well as five Academic All-District^{*} selections. The Panthers posted a program-record 3.03 GPA in Elliott's first semester and nearly matched that with a 3.0 for the spring 2020 term.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach

five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons there, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 as well as the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-

American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

Elliott was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a fouryear letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.



Georgia State fell to Army 43-10 in the season opener at Center Parc Stadium.

Head coach Shawn Elliott got right to the point after the disappointing loss. "It all starts with the head coach, and the head coach did a very poor job of preparing our team," he said.

"We didn't play very well all the way around. It was an embarrassing effort, and I told our team, 'It falls on my shoulders.' I prepared the team, and it wasn't right the way, but we certainly know how to fix it. Our players understand what it's going to take change that mindset heading into next week."

Army executed its ball-control offense to perfection, collecting 258 yards rushing and four touchdowns, while the Panthers managed just 48 yards rushing and 129 yards passing in less than 18 minutes of possession time. Georgia State hurt itself with two turnovers and a couple of untimely penalties.

"Congratulations to Coach Monken and Army," Elliott continued. "This game was about toughness today, and you quickly saw who was the tougher team out there. We fumbled on our opening possession and things just went south from there.

After the Panthers' early fumble led to a 7-0 lead for Army, Georgia State had a chance to swing the momentum when Army fumbled a punt. In an unusual sequence of events, the Panthers recovered but were flagged for holding at the line of scrimmage. After the penalty, the ensuing punt was also fumbled and recovered by the Panthers, but that play, too, was nullified by another holding call. Army held onto the third punt.

"I don't think I've punted on a possession three times, recovered two fumbles and had two holding calls," said Elliott.

With GSU trailing 21-0 midway through the second quarter, the Panthers put together a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by Destin Coates' 16-yard touchdown run on the board with four minutes left in the half.

After forcing a punt, the Panthers took over at their own 7-yard line with 1:20 left, but quarterback Cornelius Brown IV was intercepted on the first play and Army tacked on another scored to take a 27-7 lead in the locker room.

One of the bright spots for the Georgia State offense was sophomore receiver Jamari Thrash, who stepped into the starting lineup and recorded career highs with seven receptions for 87 yards, including a spectacular one-handed grab on the Panthers' lone touchdown drive.

Coates scored his 16th career touchdown and finished with 48 yards, giving him an even 1,500 for his career and tying him with Travis Evans for second place in Georgia State history. Tra Barnett is the GSU career leader with 2,156 yards.

Super senior placekicker Noel Ruiz booted a 33-yard field goal, his ninth-straight field goal dating back to last season.

Brown was 12-for-20 for 129 yards passing.

Game 2: Sept. 11, 2021 • 7:30 p.m. (RSN/ESPN3) Kenan Stadium • Chapel Hill, N.C.

Georgia State fell at No. 22 North Carolina 59-17 at Kenan Stadium.

Trailing 14-0 in the first quarter, Georgia State got some momentum when Dontae Wilson recovered a fumble at the UNC 19-yard line, setting up a 37-yard field goal by Noel Ruiz. Playing in his home state, the Wilson, N.C. native connected for the 10th straight time to put the Panthers on the board at 14-3 with 3:28 to play in the first quarter.

The Panthers put together a 17-play, 75-yard drive that ate up 7:30 on the clock in the second quarter. Tucker Gregg kept the drive alive with a fourth-down conversion on a 6-yard run to the UNC 21. Three plays later, quarterback Cornelius Brown rushed for a 4-yard touchdown to make the score 21-10 with six minutes left in the half.

Georgia State went into the half trailing 24-10, and it was still a two-possession game with six minutes to play in the third quarter, but the Tar Heels scored four-straight touchdowns, including three over a 5:24 stretch in the third quarter.

"There were times in that football game when we looked really sharp," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "In that second quarter, I was really pleased. We were playing with momentum and with effort and enthusiasm, and it's 24-10 at the half. Then we come out there in the third quarter and within the blink of an eye, it's out of hand. It's really disappointing."

Brown finished the game going 12-for-26 for 68 yards as the Panthers pounded the ball on the ground, finishing with 181 yards to hold the edge in the time of possession 30:17 to 29:43.

"At times we controlled the line of scrimmage and ran the ball well, getting four or five yards a clip. But when you're playing a team that's scoring as quickly as they did, it's hard to keep doing that," Elliott said. "We've got to have a combination of run and pass to be successful. We've got to improve.

"We didn't throw the ball and we didn't catch very well," he continued. "There were some great opportunities to make some big plays down the field, but we missed some throws and had some drops. Throwing and catching is something we do every single day, and for whatever reason, we missed it tonight.

Back-up quarterback Darren Grainger played the fourth quarter and rushed for 53 yards on four attempts, including a 36-yard scamper down to the 2-yard line. Tucker Gregg ran seven times for 31 yards, including two fourth-down conversions, while Marcus Carroll rushed six times and scored a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Sam Howell, a preseason Heisman Trophy candidate, led North Carolina, ranked No. 22 in the coaches poll and No. 24 by AP. Howell was 21-of-29 passing for 352 yards and three touchdowns, and on the ground, he rushed 11 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns.

"There's a reason why he has the talk of being the top quarterback in college football and the top pick in the NFL Draft," Elliott said..

Georgia State piled up 298 yards rushing to back an outstanding performance by the defense as the Panthers earned their first victory of the season by defeating previously unbeaten Charlotte 20-9 Saturday night at Center Parc Stadium.

Georgia State (1-2) controlled the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball as the GSU defense held the 49ers (2-1) to just 276 total yards, the seventh-lowest figure in program history and lowest since holding ULM to 262 yards in 2018.

Making his first start for the Panthers, quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 139 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 64 yards. The junior transfer threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash and a 28-yard scoring strike to Ja'Cyais Credle.

Senior running back Tucker Gregg pounded out 76 yards on 22 carries, while senior Jamyest Williams added 73 yards on just seven carries and scored his first career touchdown on a 13-yard run to seal the win with 1:38 left. Destin Coates gained 83 yards, the bulk of it on a 64-yard run.

"This win happened exactly the way we needed it to," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It was a tough contest. We really had to fight and claw. It wasn't easy by any means, but I'm very pleased with the way we did it.

"A phenomenal defensive effort. Our defense was all over the place. They were relentless. A strong running game and a great defense makes for a happy football coach," Elliott said

After allowing a safety, Georgia State trailed 9-7 midway through the third quarter when Grainger directed a 6-play, 66-yard scoring drive, capped by his 28-yard TD to Credle. That gave the Panthers their first lead at 13-9 with five minutes left in the third quarter.

Charlotte drove deep into GSU territory, but Blake Carroll caused a fumble that Chris Bacon recovered for the Panthers at the GSU 13-yard line to end the threat.

Carroll, the senior linebacker, led the Panthers with nine tackles, including a sack, plus a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

Gregg converted three fourth-down plays with short runs, giving him five fourth-down conversions in the last two games.

Georgia State started its game-clinching drive with nine minutes to play after taking over at its own 10-yard line. The 13-play, 90-yard drive was all on the ground and ate up 7:20 on the clock. Gregg and Grainger got the Panthers out to midfield, and then Williams finished the drive with an 11-yard run to the Charlotte 41, a 31-yard gain to the 13 and then a 13-yard touchdown run.

With Georgia State trailing 7-0 late in the second quarter, Grainger directed his first touchdown drive for the Panthers. After a punt, GSU took over at its own 32, and on the first play, Grainger hooked up with Ja'Cyais Credle for a 33-yard completion down the right sideline. On the next play, he found Jamari Thrash down the left side for a 35-yard touchdown, tying the score at 7-all with four minutes left in the first half.

Charlotte's first score was set up by a GSU fumble. Destin Coates broke through the line and raced 64 yards, but he was brought down at the 10-yard line and Charlotte knocked the ball out, and Shedrick Ursery recovered for the 49ers. That led to Chris Reynolds 36-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Spencer 7:41 left in the second quarter.

AUBURN 34, GEORGIA STATE 24

Game 4: Sept. 25, 2021 • 4 p.m. ET (SECN) Jordan-Hare Stadium • Auburn, Ala.

Georgia State battled No. 23 Auburn for 59 minutes but the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown on a fourth-down play with 45 seconds left and went on to win 34-24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Georgia State (1-3) took the lead early in the second quarter and still led 24-19 when Auburn took over at its own 2-yard line with 3:23 to play. The Tigers (3-1) were able to move down the field but faced 4th-and-9 at the GSU 10 when quarterback TJ. Finley scrambled and then found Shedrick Jackson in the end zone for the go-ahead score. That was the only offensive touchdown that Auburn managed against the GSU defense.

"I think our football team played one unbelievable contest," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They played as hard as they could. They fought, dug, clawed, and it's amazing that it came down to one fourth-down play.

"I couldn't be more of proud of them," Elliott continued. "The wins, for me, are about seeing their faces, so tonight it was disappointing to walk in there and see a team that had given everything they had but came up on the short end. Sports can rip you apart. That was a tough one to lose, but we'll bounce back. We've had a tough non-conference schedule, and we've got to gain confidence from coming down here and playing so hard and playing so well, but it's hard to lose."

Tucker Gregg rushed for a career-high 150 yards, including a 5-yard touchdown run, and quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 117 yards and two touchdowns. Linebacker Jordan Veneziale led the outstanding performance by the GSU defense with seven tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery.

"Our entire defense played one helluva game," Elliott said. "Time and time and time again, stop after stop. They controlled the line of scrimmage and they controlled the passing game. It was fun to watch.

"That's two weeks in a row, and if they continue to play like that, we've got one heckuva chance."

The Panthers got on the scoreboard first as Gregg's career-long 57-yard run set up Noel Ruiz's 32-yard field goal midway through the first quarter, the 11th straight make for the senior.

Auburn managed a pair of field goals before Georgia State took its first lead early in the second quarter. Grainger directed a 16-play, 75-yard drive, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass to Jamari Thrash, putting the Panthers up 10-6 with 12:45 left in the second quarter.

After an Auburn field goal cut the GSU lead to 10-9, the Panthers embarked on another 75-yard scoring drive, this time needing only five plays. After Williams started the drive with an 18-yard run, Grainger hit tight end Roger Carter for a 24-yard completion down the left sideline and rushed 11 yards for a first down at the Auburn 7. On the next play, Grainger found Carter in the end zone for the 7-yard scoring pass and the 11th career touchdown catch for Carter, who surpassed Keith Rucker for the most ever by a GSU tight end. That put the Panthers up 17-9 with seven minutes left in the half.

The Georgia State defense again held Auburn to a field goal, and after a penalty on the kickoff return, the Panthers took over at their 40. After one first down put the ball at the 50, Gregg took the handoff and broke through the middle, outracing the defense for a 50-yard touchdown run, giving Georgia State a 24-12 half-time lead.

The 50-yard run gave Gregg 142 for the first half, the most rushing yards that Auburn has allowed to any running back in the first half since LSU's Leonard Fournette gained 169 in 2015, and the most in a first half by a visiting back at Jordan-Hare since 2002.

Georgia State fell to Appalachian State 45-16 in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams. The Panthers (1-4, 0-1 Sun Belt) trailed 14-9

The Panthers (1-4, 0-1 Sun Belt) trailed 14-9 midway through the third quarter when App State (4-1, 1-0) connected on a 79-yard touchdown pass. Georgia State was still within striking distance, down 24-9, late in the third, but the Mountaineers scored three straight touchdowns to pull away.

"It snowballed on us there in the second half, and it's a very disappointing feeling," GSU head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We've got to do a lot of soul-searching. We've got to figure some things out because it certainly didn't end the way we wanted."

One bright spot for the Panthers was placekicker Noel Ruiz, who booted field goals of 23, 32, and 22 yards. The super senior from Wilson, N.C., has now made a school-record 14-straight field goals.

"You've probably heard me say that you don't win games by kicking field goals, but we were playing so well defensively and keeping it close, that I thought, Let's take the field goal and get those points," Elliott explained. "Noel is a great kicker, but we've got to punch those things in. You can't leave the ball on the 10, the 15, the 5-yard line. It's very important that you score touchdowns in the red zone."

GSU started slowly on offense as quarterback Darren Grainger threw an interception on the first drive, setting up App State's first touchdown, a 23-yard scoring run by Sun Belt rushing leader Nate Noel.

Cornelious Brown IV replaced Grainger on the third series and led the Panthers down the field for the three field goals. Brown finished 16-31 for 171 yards but threw two interceptions. Grainger finished the game with a late 66-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman Tailique Williams.

"We went into the game thinking we were going to play both quarterbacks," Elliott said. "We knew we had to get our throwing game going. We felt like we would have to throw it more in this contest to move the football."

Running back Jamyest Williams rushed for 41 yards on eight carries, along with a 19-yard reception. Marcus Carroll rushed nine times for 46 yards in the fourth quarter. Sam Pinckney and Cornelius McCoy led the receivers with four catches each.

"I really thought we played defensively until late in the third quarter," Elliott said. "I was proud of our defense. And I'm still proud of our defense, but I'm not proud of how we finished the game defensively, offensively or anything else. But the defense was giving us opportunities to get the ball back and score, and ultimately we could not do that."

GEORGIA STATE 55, ULM 21

Game 6: Oct. 9, 2021 • 8 p.m. ET (ESPN3) Malone Stadium • Monroe, La.

Darren Grainger threw four touchdown passes and rushed for a fifth score as Georgia State tied the school record for points in a 55-21 Sun Belt Conference victory at ULM.

Fifty-five points are the most the Panthers (2-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) have scored against an FBS opponent and equal the overall record, set vs. Savannah State in the inaugural season of 2010. Georgia State's 34-point margin of victory also ties a program record achieved four other times.

"We passed the test and played all four quarters," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I told them at halftime that we had a test in the second half to see if we could keep the momentum and the concentration, and we did exactly that. These guys did a great job. Anytime you come on the road and get a conference win, it's a good thing."

Grainger passed for 230 yards and rushed for 84 more as the Panthers piled up 572 yards of offense, including 326 yards on the ground. The junior signal caller tied the GSU record by accounting for five touchdowns.

Tight end Aubry Payne and wide receiver Ja'Cyais Credle caught two touchdowns apiece, while Jamyest Williams (67 yards on 12 carries), Tucker Gregg (83 yards on 15 carries) and Cornelious Brown IV added rushing scores.

Credle, the sophomore transfer, had spectacular touchdown catches of 31 and 38 yards and finished with seven catches for 130 yards, both career highs. Payne also registered his high marks with six receptions for 58 yards, including scoring plays of 10 and nine yards.

Georgia State jumped in front by scoring 28 points in the first half. Williams started the scoring with a 1-yard scoring run, capping a 10-play, 75-yard drive to tie the game at 7-all with 6:35 play left in the first quarter.

Grainger punctuated the next two long scoring marches with touchdown passes, hitting tight end Aubry Payne from 10 yards and then connecting with Ja'Cyais Credle for 31-yards scoring strike to give GSU a 21-7 lead with four minutes left in the half.

The GSU defense got the ball back two plays later as safety Jalen Tate forced a fumble that defensive end Javon Denis recovered at the ULM 34-yard line. Gregg found the end zone from two yards out for a 28-7 advantage going into the half.

The Panthers collected 19 first downs and piled up 208 yards on the ground in the first half.

Georgia State took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 75 yards on eight plays, finishing the drive with Payne's second touchdown catch.

After ULM (2-3, 1-2 Sun Belt) scored to pull within

35-21, the Panthers answered with three straight touchdowns.

"Offensively, we were in sync all night," Elliott said. "Our backs ran hard, the offensive line and tight ends and Grainger did a great job."

Sophomore safety Antavious Lane grabbed his fifth career interception. Linebacker Blake Carroll led the defense with eight tackles and one tackle for loss, and defensive end Jeffery Clark had two tackles for loss, including one sack.

Quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 200 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for a career-high 91 yards to lead Georgia State to its second straight win, 28-16 over Texas State on Homecoming.

Behind Grainger, Tucker Gregg (115 yards) and Jamyest Williams (career-high 92 yards and two touchdowns), the Panthers (3-4, 2-1 Sun Belt) piled up 298 yards on the ground, while the Georgia State defense held the Bobcats (2-5, 1-2) to just one touchdown and three field goals.

"Great Homecoming win! It was just a gutsy performance," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I'm just really proud of our football team.

"It certainly was a 60-minute game. I kept feeling like we were going to pull away, but their quarterback is a crafty player and kept scrambling and making plays. But I'm pleased with our effort, and certainly pleased with the win to keep us right there, neckand-neck, at the top of the league," continued Elliott.

Gregg, the senior from Chatsworth, Ga., topped the 1,000-yard milestone for his career on a firstquarter run. He now has 1,072 career yards.

But his biggest play was a 14-yard run in the third quarter. With the Panthers holding a 14-13 lead but facing 4th-and-1 at the GSU 42, Gregg took the handoff and appeared to be stopped at the line of scrimmage, but he bounced outside and raced 14 yards around the right end for the first down and his sixth fourth-down conversion of the season.

Three plays later, Williams ran for a 28-yard touchdown, his second of the day, to give Georgia State a 21-13 lead with eight minutes in the third quarter.

After Texas State managed its third field goal of the day to pull within 21-16, Georgia State answered with another touchdown, driving 75 yards on 11 plays, capped by Grainger's 27-yard touchdown pass to tight end Aubry Payne on the first play of the fourth quarter. Payne's third scoring pass in the last two games put the Panthers up 28-16.

The GSU defense made the lead hold up by forcing two huge turnovers in the fourth quarter. After the Bobcats drove to the GSU 34, cornerback Jaylon Jones intercepted Brady McBride's pass near the goal line.

The Panthers drove down the field and eight up nearly seven minutes on the clock but Noel Ruiz missed a 40-yard field goal attempt with 2:46 left, snapping his streak of 14 consecutive makes.

Texas State managed to move down the field late in the game, but defensive end Shamar McCollum forced a fumble that noseguard Dontae Wilson recovered at the 10-yard line to seal the win.

Trailing 6-0 in the first quarter, the Panthers got on the board with a 99-yard touchdown drive, the second 99-yard drive in program history. Grainger completed four straight passes to give the Panthers a first down at the Texas State 18, and then Jamyest Williams burst through the middle for the touchdown to put GSU ahead 7-6 with 54 seconds left in the first quarter.

On Georgia State's next possession, Grainger connected with Jamari Thrash for a 35-yard touchdown pass over the middle and a 14-6 lead early in the second quarter. But Texas State managed its only touchdown of the game, and the Panthers led 14-13 at the half.

In addition to Gregg's milestone, tight end Roger Carter topped the 1,000-yard mark for career receiving yards.

Jamyest Williams scored the game-winning touchdown on a 23-yard run with 26 seconds left to lift Georgia State to a 21-14 win over Georgia Southern at Paulson Stadium.

After its third straight win, Georgia State (4-4, 3-1) remains tied for first place in the Sun Belt East Division. The Panthers defeated their in-state rival for the second consecutive year to improve to 5-3 in the series.

"I love ball games like this," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It brings out what your team's made of. What a great win. Anytime you come to Statesboro, Ga., and walk out of here with a win, it's a great thing. I'm really proud of our football team."

Georgia State took a 14-7 lead in the fourth quarter on a pair of touchdown runs by Tucker Gregg, but Georgia Southern (2-6, 1-4) managed to tie the game with 1:39 left on Logan Wright's 9-yard run.

After the kickoff, Williams started the Panthers' game-winning drive with a 12-yard out to the GSU

39. A series of scrambles by quarterback Darren Grainger gave the Panthers a first down at the Georgia Southern 23, and then Williams finished the job with his touchdown.

"A minute and 39 seconds is a long time in this day and age, and our offense believed we were going to go down and score," Elliott said.

The Georgia State defense had to make one last stand as the Eagles moved all the way to the GSU 21 with two seconds left, but Jhi'Shawn Taylor sacked quarterback Justin Tomlin to seal the win.

Williams, the senior from Athens, finished with a career-high 97 yards rushing on just 12 carries. He gained 81 of his yards on Georgia State's two fourthquarter touchdown drives. Tucker Gregg added 87 yards and two touchdowns, and Grainger passed for 141 yards and rushed for 31.

Trailing 7-0 at the half, the Panthers finally got on the board in the third quarter on a drive that was set up by a turnover. After Georgia Southern drove into Georgia State territory, super senior safety Chris Moore intercepted Tomlin at the 1-yard line and returned it to the GSU 31.

That started a 9-play, 69-yard touchdown drive. After Grainger hit tight end Roger Carter with a 29-yard completion down the left sideline to the 2, and Gregg capped the march with 1-yard touchdown to tie the game at 7-all with eight minutes to play in the third quarter.

Georgia State took its first lead early in the fourth quarter with an 83-yard scoring drive. Williams rushed for 50 yards on the drive and Grainger had another big completion to Carter, this time a 30-yard play down the Georgia Southern 23-yard line. Two plays later, Gregg scored from three yards out for a 14-7 lead with 11 minutes left in the game.

The GSU defense came up with big plays throughout the game. Moore's interception was one of two for the Panthers as Blake Carroll also grabbed a pick in the first half. The Panthers kept Georgia Southern out of the end zone with a goal line stand in the first quarter as Javon Denis came up with a huge stop of 4th-and-goal at the 1-yard line, and safety Antavious Lane broke up a pass for a fourthdown stop in third quarter.

"Our defense did a tremendous job all night long," Elliott said.

Georgia State fell 21-17 at No. 24 Louisiana as the Ragin' Cajuns took the lead with 2:32 to play in an ESPN Thursday night game at Cajun Field.

The Panthers (4-5, 3-2 Sun Belt) took a 17-14 lead on Tucker Gregg's 1-yard touchdown run with 5:25 to play, but Louisiana (8-1, 6-0) answered with an 8-play, 71-yard drive, capped by Montrell Johnson's 13-yard scoring run.

Gregg finished with 99 yards on 23 carries. Jamyest Williams gained 82 yards, and guarterback Darren Grainger added 28 as the Panthers totaled 209 yards on the ground.

The late score overshadowed a strong performance by the GSU defense, which shut out the Ragin' Cajuns in the first half, including two fourthdown stops in the red zone.

After Louisiana took the opening kickoff and drove to a first down at the GSU 14-yard line, the Panthers held and on fourth down, defensive end Javon Denis pressured quarterback Levi Lewis into an incompletion.

The Panthers took over at the 8 began moving the ball on the ground. On 2 nd-and-9 at the 50, Grainger hit tight end Roger Carter for 24 yards to the 26. Four plays later, Noel Ruiz put Georgia State on the scoreboard with a 39-yard field with five minutes in the first quarter.

Louisiana drove deep into Georgia State territory late in the first half. On 4th-and-2 at the GSU 6, the Ragin' Cajuns elected to go for it, and senior outside linebacker Jacorey Crawford sacked Lewis to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 3-0 lead.

That is the first scoreless half for the GSU defense since the Panthers shut out Charlotte in 2017.

The defense came up with another big play in the third quarter as Antavious Lane intercepted Lewis at midfield.

Lane's interception, the sixth of his career, gave Georgia State it's best starting field position of the day at the GSU 48. After two runs by Williams moved the Panthers to the 37, Grainger connected with Carter over the middle for the touchdown and a 10-0 lead with 8:46 to play in the third quarter.

Carter's 12th career touchdown was also his 90th career reception to tie Keith Rucker for the most by a GSU tight end.

Louisiana's first points came on Lewis' 13-yard touchdown pass to Pete LeBlanc, pulling within 10-7 with six minutes left in the third. On their next drive, the Ragin' Cajuns took the lead on Johnson's 3-yard touchdown with 13 minutes to play.

The Panthers took the ensuing kickoff and drove 75 yards on 16 plays, all on the ground. Gregg accounted for 48 of those yards, capped by his 1-yard scoring run, along with two carries and 18 yards by Williams and one 7-yards scramble by Grainger.

"A tough, hard fought game and a tough loss," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Offensively, defensively and special teams, we just couldn't make enough plays to pull out the win against a good football team. We had every opportunity, we really did.

"What a tough loss for our football team. They prepared hard, and they fought hard, but it just didn't happen tonight. I'm extremely proud of our football team."

Georgia State earned its first ever win over a nationally-ranked opponent by stopping a two-point conversion attempt with 1:09 to play, preserving the Panthers 42-40 win at No. 22/21 Coastal Carolina at Brooks Stadium.

Facing its fourth ranked opponent of the season Georgia State (5-5, 4-2 Sun Belt) snapped Coastal Carolina's (8-2, 4-2) 12-game home winning streak and likely knocked the Chanticleers out of the polls after 22 straight weeks.

"I can't tell you how proud I am of this football team," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We talked about it all week ... it takes 60 minutes, and tonight it took every second of those 60 minutes to get this victory."

Playing in his hometown before a large contingent of family and friends, GSU quarterback Darren Grainger, who attended Conway High School, passed for 198 yards and two touchdowns, and running backs Jamyest Williams (83 yards, 1 TD) and Tucker Gregg (67 yards, 3 TD) combined for 150 yards rushing and four touchdowns.

"It feels good to be home, and it feels good to get a win over a ranked opponent," Grainger said.

Grainger hit Terrance Dixon with a 2-yard touchdown pass on fourth down to give the Panthers a 35-34 lead with five minutes left. On Coastal Carolina's ensuing possession, GSU outside linebacker Jamil Muhammad sacked quarterback Bryce Carpenter, causing a fumble that Jontrey Hunter recovered at the Coastal 8-yard line.

Two plays later, Gregg punched in his third touchdown of the day with a 4-yard run, and Georgia State led 42-34 with 2:36 to play.

But Coastal Carolina drove 75 yards on eight plays, capped by Carpenter's 17-yard touchdown pass to tight end Isaiah Likely with 1:07 left. On the two-point conversion, Carpenter threw incomplete in the corner of the end zone, but pass interference was called. This time, the Chanticleers ran the ball up the middle, and the Georgia State defense made the stop as Thomas Gore wrapped up Shemari Jones.

Georgia State receiver Ja'Cyais Credle recovered the ensuing onside kick, and the Panthers ran out the clock for the huge win.

Trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, the Panthers drove 75 yards on 11 plays to tie the game on Gregg's 2-yard run. The key play on the drive was Grainger's 22-yard completion down to the CCU 30 to tight end Roger Carter, who finished with three catches for 70 yards.

With that first catch, Carter became Georgia State's career leader in receptions and receiving yards by a tight end. The Columbia, S.C., native now has (90+ receptions for 1137+ yards), passing Keith Rucker (90-1148).

After Coastal regained the lead at 14-7, Grainger directed another 75-yard drive. After Grainger found tight end Aubry Payne for a 3-yard scoring pass to tie the game at 14-all with a minute left in the first quarter.

Three plays later, Georgia State cornerback Quavian White intercepted Carpenter at midfield and returned it 36 yards to the 1, and Gregg took it in from there, giving the Panthers their first lead at 21-14 on the first play of the second quarter.

White's interception is the seventh career pick for the Greer, S.C., native, tying Chandon Sullivan's school record.

After Coastal Carolina managed a safety, the Panthers added to their lead with another 75-yard drive, this one capped by Williams' 36-yard touchdown run for a 28-16 lead with five minutes in the half.

Coastal scored a touchdown just before the half, and then struck first in the third quarter with a touchdown and then a field goal to pull within 28-26 with five minutes in the quarter. The Chanticleers moved ahead 34-28 on Jones' third rushing touchdown with nine minutes left.

As they had all day, the Panthers drove the length of the field as Grainger directed an 11-play, 75-yard drive. Carter again figured prominently with a 39-yard catch down to the CCU 16. After Grainger scrambled 8-yards for a first down at the 6, the Panthers needed all four downs before Dixon's touchdown catch on 4th-and-goal at the 2.

"What a gutsy performance by Darren, playing right here in his backyard," Elliott said. "He ran the ball

effectively, he delivered the ball nicely in the throw game, and he made good decisions. I'm very proud of what he accomplished tonight. He's got a big smile on his face, an that's something he'll never forget."

GEORGIA STATE 28, ARKANSAS STATE 20

Game 11: Nov. 20, 2021 • 2 p.m. (ESPN3) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State is bowl eligible for the third straight year after a 28-20 victory over Arkansas State, fueled by a dominating performance by the Panthers' defense.

The GSU defense collected 15 tackles for loss with six sacks, and held the Red Wolves (2-9, 1-6 Sun Belt) to just 270 total yards, including a school-record minus-3 rushing yards, as the Panthers won for the fifth time in their last six games to improve to 6-5 overall and 5-3 in the Sun Belt Conference.

"Congratulations to our football team on becoming bowl eligible for the third straight year, something that's never been done before at Georgia State," said head coach Shawn Elliott, who has guided the Panthers to bowl eligibility in four of his five seasons.

"I'm very proud of our team. We made the plays to get it done," Elliott continued. "This game is tough, and today might have been one of the tougher ones. We weren't crisp, to the very end. I tell them all the time, You've got to play 60 minutes the hardest and the longest, and we love using every second of that 60-minute ballgame. But I'm thrilled to death. We're going bowling, and that feels really good."

On offense, Jamyest Williams rushed for a careerhigh 125 yards and two touchdowns on just 16 carries and Tucker Gregg added 99 yards and one score as the Panthers piled up 282 yards on the ground. Quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 152 yards and rushed for 46, including a 35-yard touchdown run.

Jamari Thrash led the receiving corps with a career-high 108 yards on four catches.

But the defense was the story of the day.

"We talked all week about 609 yards offense, 551 passing yards, eight touchdowns a year in a 59-52 loss a year ago," Elliott said, referencing last year's game at Arkansas State. "They came out and played fantastic football. They were relentless all day. Offensively, we put them in a lot of tough situations, and they responded. I'm just proud of them."

Defensive lineman Thomas Gore led the way with seven tackles, including two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. Outside linebacker Jontrey Hunter made eight tackles, including a school record-tying four tackles for loss, along with a pass breakup.

Noseguard Dontae Wilson had two tackles for loss, including one sack to move into second place in GSU history with 11.0 career sacks, trailing teammate teammate Hardrick Willis (12.5).

On the back end, cornerback Bryquice Brown stopped a scoring drive with an interception at the 1-yard line and added two pass breakups. Safety Antavious Lane also grabbed an interception, along with a forced fumble, a tackle for loss and two pass breakups. Cornerback Jaylon Jones had six tackles and three pass breakups.

Lane's interception was his third of the season and the seventh of his career to tie the Georgia State career record, equaling teammate Quavian White and current Green Bay Packer Chandon Sullivan.

After Grainger's 35-yard touchdown run gave Georgia State a 28-13 lead with six minutes left, the Panthers stopped Arkansas State on four downs deep in the Red Wolves territory. GSU took over at the ASU 18, looking to put the game away, but Arkansas State returned a fumble 80 yards for a touchdown to pull within 28-20 with 4:22 to play.

But Gregg converted two third downs to allow Georgia State to run out the clock.
